Dog and cat registrations overdue

Is your dog unregistered?

If your pet is currently unregistered, you can simply register or renew the dog or cat registration on the internet with the new Dogs and Cats Online website which was launched on 1 July 2018. Reminder notices were sent out early September 2018 which included a \$15.00 late fee because registrations were due on the 31 August 2018.



Our Community Safety Officer is currently contacting owners of unregistered dogs to ensure the pets details are updated and re-registered in DACO.

Please contact Council's Customer Experience Team to notify us if your dog has died, or has transferred out of the Town of Walkerville area or alternatively visit dogsandcatsonline.com.au to complete the details yourself.

Please be advised it is an offence to own/be responsible for an unregistered dog and can attract an expiation of \$170.00 if the registration remains outstanding.

If you did not receive your original dog registration with silver tag, you will need to complete a statutory declaration form and submit to Council for review.
