1. This week, Administration provided the following response to journalist Matt Smith at the Advertiser/Sunday Mail for a Council-wide story of Code of Conduct complaints:

*Since the 2014 local government elections:*

- a) *How many code of conduct complaints have the Council investigated ? Response: 2*
- b) *How many code of conduct complaints are still open ? Response: 0*
- c) *How many code of conduct complaints have been closed ? Response: 2*
- d) *How many code of conduct complaints have been forwarded to the Ombudsman. Response: **No complaints were forwarded to the Ombudsman by Council. However, the Ombudsman received a Code of Conduct complaint against an Elected Member from a member of the public, which was duly investigated by his office.***

2. Raymond Grigg, Mayor of Walkerville, provided the following statement to journalist Eugene Boisvert from the Eastern Courier for an article on the opening of the Gilberton Swing Bridge.

*"It's wonderful to see the Gilberton Swing Bridge open to the public. ## NDIS Eastern Adelaide Expo – Tuesday 20 February 2018

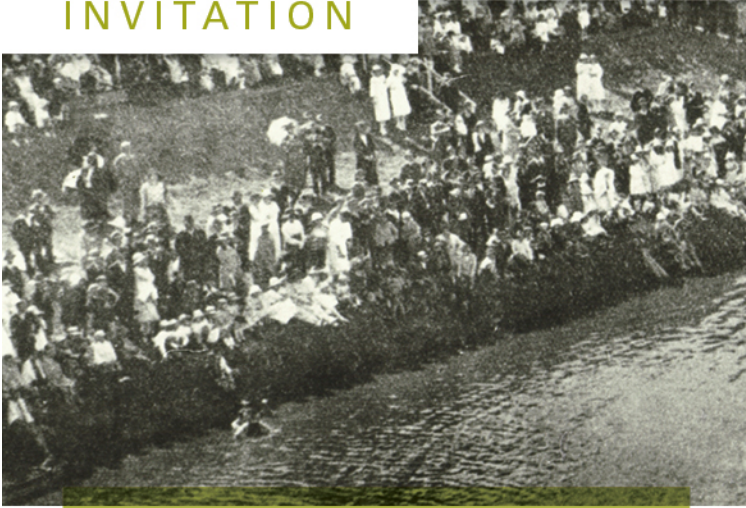
**This is a free community information expo for people with disability, family and carers, and people interested in working in the disability sector.**
