Location: 19 St Andrews Street Walkerville SA 5081  
Zoning: Residential Character Zone (Church Terrace and Environs Policy Area 10)  
Proposal: Partial demolition of a Contributory Item with alterations and two storey additions with integrated garage with an associated pool, pool pump, pool fencing, masonry and battened front fence with additional height to the existing brush fence and corrugated iron boundary fencing.

The Panel resolved to grant this application Development Plan Consent, subject to conditions.

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

As of	New law	Benefit
1 July 2017	Increased fines and penalties for irresponsible dog and cat owners	To ensure financial penalties act as genuine deterrents to those who flout the law
1 August 2017	New mandatory minimum standards and advisory guidelines for breeders and sellers of companion animals	To ensure higher standards of care for companion animals are met at breeding facilities, shops and other sources of pets
1 July 2018	All dogs and cats must be microchipped by 3 months	To increase the number of lost dogs and cats returned their owners
1 July 2018	All dogs and cats born after this date must be desexed, with exemptions for working dogs and registered breeders	To reduce the number of unwanted animals ending up in shelters
1 July 2018	Anyone who breeds dogs or cats for sale must register with the Dog and Cat Management Board	To better manage the industry and make it harder for puppy farmers to ply their unscrupulous trade
1 July 2018	The Dog and Cats Online website will be launched to manage dog, cat and breeder registrations across South Australia	To save councils time and money and assist owners to better manage their pets

Community playgrounds can play an important role in the social and physical development and wellbeing of children.


As part of Council's ongoing asset renewal program, this community playground will be upgraded with new play equipment, designed, built and installed to industry standards.

## Wesleyan Cemetery Advisory Committee – Expressions of Interest

Council at its 19 March 2018 ordinary meeting, resolved to establish the Wesleyan Cemetery Advisory Committee

Council is now looking for four interested persons from the community who would like to volunteer their time as members of the Wesleyan Cemetery Advisory Committee. The Advisory Committee is expected to meet four times per year. The Committee will also include two elected members and two Council administration representatives.

Its key functions will be to:

- Help promote and encourage the enjoyment and appreciation of the Wesleyan Historic Cemetery;
- Identify opportunities for the enhancement of the Cemetery;
- Conduct education and informative guided tours;
- Advice in the restoration, preservation and maintenance of the Cemetery

- grounds in a well planned and respectful manner;
- Advise in the restoration of headstones and grave furniture;
  - Report to Council on matters relating to the Cemetery;
  - Assist in and contribute to historic research;
  - Provide recommendations for a work program that lists all work tasks performed at the Cemetery grounds;
  - Raise funds through fund raising activities for the repair and / or refurbishment of headstones installed prior to 1 June 2004;
  - Support and assist the Council Administration to apply for grants as appropriate;
  - Develop and maintain an (indicative) annual restoration plan for grave repairs;
  - Make recommendations to Council on all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, both for the old and new sections of Cemetery, which may include infrastructure requirements or community expectations;
  - Comply with the Education & Informative Guided Tour Standard Operating Procedure;
  - Make recommendations to Council on leasing and sub-leasing matters;
  - Liaise and engage with members of the public who have an interest in refurbishing their family grave. This may include informative guided tours;
  - Liaise and engage with members of the broader community and / or Schools, who have an interest in the Cemetery. This may include informative guided tours;
  - Comply with Council's WHS Policy and Procedures;
  - Undertake training as required;
  - Provide and wear at all times appropriate personal protective equipment, such as gloves, sunscreen, hats, appropriate clothing and shoes;
  - Liaise with Councils Team Leader Works, or nominee, to support Councils' weed spraying programme in the Cemetery as required;
  - Support and be informed in relation to works and matters pertaining to the contracted management of the Cemetery

## **Construction Works on Rose Street/ Park Terrace corner and Carpark Opposite Mersey Street under**

The Project is aimed at renewing the carpark around the Morton Bay Fig tree to provide more open space for the tree and incorporate permeable paving within the new car park.

40% of the carpark is still available during construction.

Following this work the contractor will undertake the raised pavement, designed to protect the roots of the Listed Red Gum tree at the corner of Rose Street and Park Terrace. This corner will be closed to through traffic for the duration of this work. Residents have been informed of the proposed works.

SA Water provided an update to Council this week.


The tender for the works has now closed and SA Water is expect to award the work in the coming weeks. SA Water will advise Council of the successful contractor and work start date soon after.

# Lansdowne Terrace Stormwater & Road Project Update

Stormwater pipelaying commenced this week.

Council's Contractor has successfully laid approximately 30m of pipe. They major formwork for the pit and the end of Lansdowne Terrace has also been finalised.

Next week works will shift focus to the Walkerville Terrace, Lansdowne Terrace and Vale Street intersection during school holidays to minimise traffic disruptions. Further updates to be provided as needed.
