

FROM THE MAYOR OF WALKERVILLE

I would like to start this column by expressing my thanks to the **Town of Walkerville** community for putting their trust in me to lead our **Council as Mayor for** the next four years. It is a great privilege and I look forward to meeting and working with as many of you as possible over the term.

On Australia Day, the Town of Walkerville welcomed six new citizens into our community. These new Australians came from China, India, Russia, Taiwan and the United Kingdom. It was a lovely ceremony in the Town Hall, which represented the formality of the occasion, as well as the celebration of our country and what it truly means to be Australian. I reflected on the words of Noel Pearson in his 2022 Boyer Lecture and the three stories which make modern Australia: the ancient Indigenous heritage, which

is Australia's foundation, the British institutions built upon it, and the adorning gift of multicultural migration.

These new citizens bring to our community their rich cultures, knowledge, skills and enthusiasm for and commitment to our values. They are part of that third story of cultural diversity in a nation that is one of the world's most successful multicultural societies.

At the December 2022 Council meeting, Council resolved to appoint members to the Women of Walkerville Committee. At a workshop in January 2023, the newly appointed Committee Members commenced a preliminary review of their Terms of Reference with a view of making recommendations to Council in the future.

The purpose of the review was to improve the Committee by creating a greater sense of inclusivity and community orientation, as well as giving more back to our community and renaming the Committee as the Walkerville Community Committee. Council have since endorsed this position and are now calling for

expressions of interest from those interested in being part of the Committee. To find out further details or to express your interest, please scan the QR code: All welcome!

It is very clear to me and other members of Council that parking and traffic issues are of major concern for residents of the Town of Walkerville. Council will be embarking on a Townshipwide traffic management consultation, and I encourage you to have your say on both specific and general issues

from parking permits, parking restrictions, speed limits, traffic calming measures or other transportrelated issues. Your feedback is important and will inform how Council manages traffic matters into the future.

Drop-in sessions will be held at the Civic and Community Centre from 10am - 11am on 18 March 2023 and 5.30pm - 7pm on 20 March 2023, where you will be able to ask questions of Administration, Elected Members and traffic consultants, in addition to being able to provide feedback through the regular engagement avenues.

Lastly, I would like to use my quarterly column in About Town to highlight groups who do great work in our community. "Vale Park Our Patch" is a group of residents who work along the Linear Park to remove weeds and replace them with native plants in order to restore native vegetation, beautify the local area for users of Linear Park and provide shelter and food for native insects, birds and small

animals that call the river their home. This group cares for sites in both Vale Park and Gilberton.

Another group with a similar purpose working on the Lansdowne Terrace Linear Park Gateway Revegetation Project was recently the recipient of a community grant from Council to purchase materials for their work. There is no doubt that there are other groups completing similar work along the Torrens, and I thank you for what you do. I remind all individuals and community groups in the Town of Walkerville that grants are available, where criteria is met. More information is available in this edition of About Town, as well as on Council's website.

Community Fund Program

Did you know that the Town of Walkerville has a Community Fund Program where Council can grant money to residents, ratepayers and not-for-profit groups operating within the Township?

Community bus

The Town of Walkerville provides a free community bus service for residents of all ages, who have difficulty using public transport or do not have access to, or the ability to, use a private vehicle.

The community bus is a 'door to door' service where a friendly driver picks passengers up from their home and transports them to Northpark Shopping Centre.

Pick up times are 10am and 11am every Friday (excluding public holidays).

A Council staff member will then send an information registration pack, which must be completed and returned prior to use of the service.

Celebrating our citizens

From Eastern Asia to the United Kingdom – citizens from across the globe officially joined the Town of Walkerville community as Australians at a special ceremony on 26 January 2023.

Mayor Melissa Jones was honoured to confer citizenship on six residents – from China, India, Russia, Taiwan and the United Kingdom – as their proud family and friends watched on. Australian citizenship ceremonies are an important part of our nation's celebrations.

Our newest citizens have joined a special group of Australians who celebrate the anniversary of their citizenship each Australia Day.

Mayor Jones said the skills and cultural diversity of the new citizens, as well as their participation in our community, enriches the experience of all of us. "Walkerville is Adelaide's smallest metropolitan Council, but we are a true reflection of Australia's demographic. Two-thirds of Walkerville's population were born overseas, which is the same as Australia as a whole. More than half of our population have at least one parent who was born overseas, again a similar reflection to the whole of Australia. I am one of those people. My parents were both immigrants to Australia.



Through this we know that the country from which you have come will always be a part of your life. We are grateful that you bring to us your rich cultures, your knowledge, your skills and your enthusiasm for and commitment to our values."

FOOD WASTE AND COMPOSTING POP-UP EDUCATION STALL



Why waste your food scraps?

Did you know that you can easily reduce Council's waste by 42% by using a kitchen caddy system to collect food scraps and other compostable material?

Collect all your food scraps, uneaten food and other compostable items such as coffee grounds, tea bags, tissues and paper towel in the kitchen caddy. Materials should then be placed into your green 'food and garden organics bin' for composting. Kitchen caddies and compostable bags are available for **FREE** from the Civic and Community Centre, 66 Walkerville Terrace, Gilberton. Ratepayers are entitled to one free roll of BioBags per household each calendar year and a once-off free kitchen caddy.

Transport Strategy

From speeding and rat running to parking and cycling connectivity – the Town of Walkerville is seeking feedback regarding traffic and safety issues within the district.

Council is undertaking a Township-wide engagement process to identify key transport concerns, which will help inform a local Transport Strategy. The purpose of the study is to create a strategy that plans for an integrated transport system that meets the needs of the residents and visitors as pedestrians, cyclists, motorists and public transport users.

Council will consider community comments, as well as evidence-based traffic data, to develop the Transport Strategy.

As part of the process, the community is encouraged to complete the transport survey and attend a drop-in session if they have any specific questions related to the strategy.

Council development projects



The new Council is in the process of considering the next steps for both the Walkerville Oval redevelopment and 39 Smith Street project.

At presstime for *About Town*, Elected Members were in the process of workshopping the two major developments. Further updates will be available on the respective news pages on Council's

website and the community will be further consulted this year.

Council acknowledges the State Government for its contribution of \$4 million as part of the Local Government Infrastructure Partnership Program for the Walkerville Oval redevelopment and \$5 million for the 39 Smith Street project.



Walkerville Library survey

Council wishes to thank all community members who provided feedback in the Walkerville Library engagement process at the end of last year.

From October to November 2022, Administration undertook a survey to assist in determining how Council can better support the community in library services, programs and events.

A total of 326 surveys were received, which provide invaluable feedback and will help Council to gain a better understanding of how the community uses the library and what members of the public would like to see implemented moving forward.

The findings reveal that the community is highly satisfied with the current functions of Walkerville Library, while also identifying potential programs and ideas for future consideration.

Key statistics included:

- **90%** of respondents are satisfied with Walkerville Library overall.
- 87% enjoy visiting the library to borrow items from the local collection.
- The majority of library users are extremely satisfied with Walkerville Library, attributing this to the staff and customer service, as well as the library's atmosphere and space.
- Of those less satisfied with the library, expanding the physical catalogue, reassessing opening hours and increasing additional activities would improve library use.

Based on the survey results, Council will be undertaking further research. Stay tuned!

Works about Town

Alfred Street: road and streetscape upgrade

The plan to transform **Alfred Street into** a green "avenue" connecting Walkerville Terrace to the oval precinct is almost complete.

Major works to replace the bitumen with a permeable pavement design for improved stormwater have been completed, along with creating one-way vehicle access to improve pedestrian safety and a new dedicated footpath for

ease of access between Walkerville Terrace and the oval precinct.

Despite setbacks due to unexpected underground utilities and summer storms, the roadworks were finished within the original timeframe of January 2023. The final stage of the project is the planting of street trees and garden beds, which will be installed by Council's field staff from March 2023 when the weather is cooler, to ensure the survival of the new plants.

The upgrade has included the:

 transformation of Alfred Street into a one-way avenue (entrance from Walkerville Terrace and exit via Warwick Street) to assist with parking and vehicle access;

- creation of a promenade link between Walkerville Terrace and Walkerville Oval to provide safer pedestrian linkages;
- installation of an additional three car parking spaces (seven on the Warwick Street side and four on the Walkerville Terrace end);
- removal of the existing garden bed adjacent to the tennis courts to make way for additional car parking, new garden beds and street trees;
- upgrade of surfaces to permeable pavement for stormwater management.

Council is extremely grateful to the nearby residents for their patience during this project in relation to property access and vehicle movement.

2023 Road Reseal Program

As part of Council's ongoing commitment to keep local roads well managed and driveable, resurfacing work has been undertaken in Vale Park as part of an annual reseal program.

The program is designed to improve and restore the road pavement, manage stormwater and provide a safe and comfortable driving surface. Asphalt resealing is designed to last up to 30 years, depending on usage of the road, and stops water seeping into the seal, which helps to prevent the formation of potholes, surface cracks and soft spots within the road surface.



The roads included in the program this year were:

- · Milne Street;
- · Stewart Avenue;
- · William Road; and
- Mimosa Drive.

Roads for the 2023/24 year will be identified during Council's upcoming budget process.

Can you crack the code?

As you wander through the arch gateway, past the timber nature play logs and towards the lush green grass labyrinth – you will stumble across a variety of clues hidden throughout Hamilton Reserve.

Etched into pieces of stone and installed along random sections of the nature play space area are secret icons that each reveal a letter. Once each icon has been located, the circle layer surrounding the grass labyrinth will allow the encrypted puzzle to be deciphered.

> Tip: remember to take a notepad and pen to decode the mystery message hidden with the park.



Hamilton Reserve (formally known as Stewart Avenue Park), on the corner of Mimosa Drive and Stewart Avenue, was upgraded in 2021/22.

From a children's bike track loop and nature play equipment, to undercover barbecue areas and range of plants – the park is a

popular place for the community to meet, play and enjoy.

Council acknowledges the Government of South Australia for its contribution of \$319,825 towards the project as part of the 2020/21 Open Space and Places for People Grant Program.


