Christmas closure for Council

The Civic & Community Centre and Walkerville Library will be closed over the Christmas break - offices shut from 12pm on Friday, December 2023 and reopen at 9am on Tuesday, 2 January 2024.

Public holiday waste collections

Waste collections will change slightly due to Christmas. There will be no bin collections on Christmas Day. Collections from 25-29 December 2023 will occur the day after normal pick-up.

There will also be no bin collections on New Year's Day. All collections will move to the next day.

Council is deeply saddened by the event that came to pass in Gilberton – an incident that has shaken the community as a whole.


Michael was a highly-regarded member of the Walkerville community, with his influence and expertise stretching far and wide across the State – helping many young children and families over his career.

IPWEA judges recognised the Alfred Street project due to its unique design, which showcased how green corridors can be created within restricted urban environments.

Township-wide Community Survey consultation undertaken



A six-week Community Survey consultation was undertaken in 2023.

The last Community Survey occurred a number of years ago, as a result of disruptions from COVID-19.

Council received positive results from the public in the survey, which found that Town of Walkerville was outperforming other councils in overall community satisfaction, along with a range of other areas, such as customer services, parks and consultation.

Notice of public meeting to reactive the Walkerville Residents' Association

A meeting will be held early next year with the aim to reactivate the Walkerville Residents' Association (WRA), which has been inactive for the past four years.

The meeting, open to all residents of the Town of Walkerville, will be held from 6pm-7pm on Monday, 5 February 2024, at the Walkerville Civic & Community Centre in Room 1855 (entrance will be available via the rear car park, off Stephen Terrace).

Residents will be aware that a proposed new development on the site of the Buckingham Arms Hotel is currently under consideration by the State Commission Assessment Panel (SCAP). This proposed new development consists of three 10-storey towers with some 180 residences. Several residents in the Walkerville Council area have significant concerns about this development.

A revived Walkerville Resident's Association, open to all residents of the Walkerville, Vale Park, Gilberton and Medindie areas, aims to discuss the proposed design and size of the development, including traffic and environmental aspects at the entry to Walkerville Terrace.

Weekly waste tips - Christmas edition

This Christmas, don't forgot these tips to ensure you are properly recycling waste after the holidays.



- Do not put seafood waste into local park or street litter bins, as it can create unpleasant smells in public spaces;
- Bones, meat and seafood often end up in landfill after Christmas, however, all this waste can be put in the green bin;
- Polystyrene packaging, which often comes with larger Christmas gifts, should not be placed in the recycling bin as it is a 'No Foam Zone'. You can find a drop-off location for polystyrene here;
- If you receive a new electronic device for Christmas, make sure to properly recycle your old devices through e-waste recycling options in the area – which you can find here; and
- Make your New Year's resolution to recycle more and waste less!
