At the recent Women of Walkerville Foundation's Mother's Day High Tea event, I was honoured to stand in front of a crowd and speak of our efforts in raising funds for families affected by domestic violence.

I felt gratitude for the opportunity to be a mother myself and I was filled with a sense of pride when I thought how blessed I was to be able to raise two beautiful daughters in a safe, warm and loving environment. My address

was somewhat bittersweet, as it was in preparation for this day that I learnt of alarming new police statistics, which showed a significant rise in domestic assaults during the height of COVID-19. I thought of all the mothers and children who were not as fortunate as myself and my girls.

Since the beginning of the coronavirus pandemic, domestic violence cases increased by 11% across South Australia. New police data revealed a rise in domestic assaults from 8,587 in 2019 to 9,526 in 2020. It became even more

apparent why the Women of Walkerville Foundation (of which I am Chair) is so important in its quest to undertake fundraising activities to support social endeavours that benefit the community. In particular, its support of the Eastern Adelaide Domestic Violence Service – an organisation which helps women and children experiencing or escaping domestic or family violence.

Earlier this year, members of the Women of Walkerville Foundation were invited for a tour of the service where we presented a cheque for \$1,500 to support the families involved with the organisation. We not only experienced firsthand the dedication and hard work of the staff, but also the emotional stories of the women and children they assist. We witnessed the passion of the carers and their dedication to assisting these women, which was truly incredible.

I wish to thank all members of the community who attended our Mother's Day High Tea on 7 May 2021. It

was an excellent turnout with our special guest speaker Amanda Vanstone AO and we donated an additional \$2,000 to the Eastern Adelaide Domestic Violence Service thanks to funds raised on this day.

Council not only supports charity and social endeavours, but we also place a great emphasis on our community groups. On 25 April 2021, I was honoured to present the keynote address at

the ANZAC Day Dawn Ceremony. It was wonderful to see so many of the community stand united to commemorate our ANZACs.

As we look ahead, Council has proposed a number of exciting projects for the coming financial year.

The Draft 2021/22 Annual Business Plan begins the delivery of a redevelopment more than 30 years in the making.

The upgrade of Walkerville Oval will be one of the largest community projects in the history of our Council and I am delighted to lead the way as we move forward with our plans to redevelop the precinct to provide a sporting and community hub that services the needs of both current and future generations.

In March 2021, I was pleased to be advised that the \$8 million proposal for our flagship parcel of open space in the Township was set to become more than just a proposal – it was going ahead. Receiving confirmation that Council had been granted 50% of the funding from the State Government was the turning point for this project.

I look forward to keeping you updated as we move ahead with plans to build the new Walkerville Oval hub – a community facility that is set to create a vibrant precinct, as well as boost the local economy.

Works about Town



Willow Bend toilet upgrade

The Willow Bend toilet block will be repurposed as a storage shed and a new disability friendly and automated self-cleaning Exeloo will be installed. The \$200,000 project will result in reduced maintenance costs and complement planned beatification and tennis court works nearby. In addition, the tennis courts will be resurfaced and a basketball ring will be installed. Works are expected to be completed by October.

Levi Park project

A table tennis table, new fenced enclosure, bench seats and a barbecue will be installed as part of an upgrade to a small section of Levi Park, closest to Lansdowne Terrace. The

project aims to create a new community destination in the area. Works should be finished by the end of financial year. Once the upgrade is completed, the adjoining tennis courts will be resurfaced.

Hamilton Reserve makeover

Beginning June

This prime piece of open space in Vale Park, adjacent to Mimosa Drive, will be receiving an upgrade to create better usage and enjoyment by the community. A barbecue, shelter and new seating will be installed, along with a nature play area, grass labyrinth, native garden beds and a bike loop track. The project is expected to be completed in October.

As part of the Draft 2021/22 Annual Business Plan, we seek to remain fiscally prudent, while utilising our resources to their capacity to deliver the best possible services for our community.

We will continue to incorporate innovative environmental design measures into our ongoing assets and maintenance programs and we are looking

forward to more community events in the future. We have set aside funds to improve facilities at our parks, playgrounds and streetscapes, as well as reintroducing the popular Christmas Fair.

Parking Permit Zone

There is less than one month until new 3-hour parking restrictions in Gilberton and Medindie come into place.

In January 2021, Council announced that a new 3-hour Parking Permit Zone would be implemented in parts of Gilberton and Medindie.

These parking restrictions will be enforced from 1 July 2021 between 8am and 5pm, from Monday to Friday.

New signage was installed in March 2021 throughout Gilberton and Medindie to communicate the planned parking changes and provide time to adjust to the upcoming parking restrictions.

Residents will be able to apply for on-street fixed parking permits (subject to eligibility and permit fee), as well as request one free transferable residential parking permit.

Vehicles parked on the street must display these permits to be exempt from the 3-hour parking restrictions.

The changes come following community concern in relation to non-resident cars being parked on streets for extended periods of time.

Walkerville Oval redevelopment



Following the appointment of an architectural firm, the Walkerville Oval sports and community hub redevelopment is now ready to proceed.

The Adelaide firm includes a studio of talented and experienced design professionals, who have more than 40 years' experience in creating large public structures. Their clients include Adelaide Airport, Australian Federal Police, University of South

Australia, Scotch College and the SANFL.

The current \$8 million redevelopment proposal is one of Council's largest community projects to date. The plan includes two buildings fit-for-purpose (linked by an external arbour) to accommodate user groups, commercial activity and to increase the community's access to, engagement with and use of the site, while also maximising the retention

of available open space. Council was notified of its success in receiving a \$4 million State Government grant towards the project in March 2021, which ensured the redevelopment would go ahead. It is expected that the redevelopment will commence in July 2021 and be completed in June 2023, though subject to change.

As Council progresses with the project, information will be shared on its website.

From Ireland and Hong Kong to Mauritius and South Korea – there was a great global representation of people who officially joined the Town of Walkerville community as Australian citizens in March.

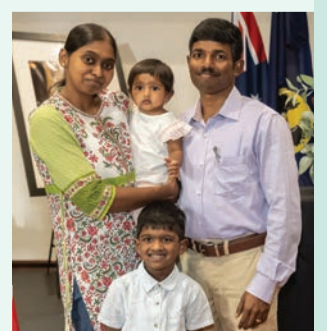
Mayor Elizabeth Fricker was honoured to confer citizenship on 10 residents – who also came from India, Denmark and China – as their proud family and friends watched on.

Abandoned vehicles

If you believe you may have an abandoned vehicle in your street, there are several factors to look out for that can help you identify if the subject car is in fact abandoned.

Vehicles that have been parked for an extended period of time (no less than 48 hours) may cause resident concerns, especially if not recognised as belonging to the area.

Similarly, visible signs of damage to the vehicle or signs such as leaves and debris build-up at the wheel bases, flat tyres or forced entry can be determinants of an abandoned vehicle.

It is important to remember that vehicles owned by nearby residents, whether actively used or not, are not considered abandoned vehicles.

Local residents are permitted to park in the street for any length of time provided they are parked legally and their vehicles carry a valid motor registration.

Council will not consider investigating vehicles due to them being an inconvenience. For action to be taken, all vehicles must be deemed as abandoned.

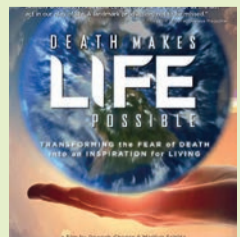
