Gilberton Transport and Parking Study

The Town of Walkerville has appointed GTA Consultants to conduct a transport and parking study for the **southern section** of the suburb of Gilberton to address issues for transport safety, mobility and access and parking in the local streets bounded by Stephen Terrace, Walkerville Terrace, Park Road and the River Torrens. The orange-shaded area shows the study area.



In order to properly identify and address issues with traffic, transport and parking, the study has various community consultation and stakeholder engagement activities. Council, with the assistance of GTA Consultants, aims to engage thoroughly with the residents, stakeholders, business owners and visitors to the area to develop a holistic picture of where the issues are and where appropriate and practical improvements can be made. The data collection and other technical tasks start in early February 2020. The study is scheduled to conclude by the end of May 2020.

Feedback received during this period will be used to prepare an issues paper identifying the key areas of concern for traffic and parking within the southern part of Gilberton (south of Walkerville Terrace). Heritage Plaques Grants Now Open

The Town of Walkerville adopted its first ever Heritage Plaques Policy at the 17 June 2019 Council Meeting. Applications to install a Heritage Plaque are now open.

Heritage plaques showcase the historical significance of buildings that make a valuable contribution to the historic character of Walkerville. The heritage plaques are not only limited to residential dwellings, but also include a range of buildings, landmarks and statues, plants/trees and kerbing.

Heritage: A site that has been identified in the Development Plan to meet the relevant criteria for Local or State heritage listing, in accordance with the *Development Act 1993* and the *Heritage Places Act 1993*.

Council desired outcome is to highlight the Township's rich and vibrant culture. By increasing the number of heritage plaques in the Town of Walkerville, Council will be formally recognising its local and state history, ensuring it is displayed, enhanced, celebrated and most importantly, protected by the appropriate legislation.

Each plaque will identify the property name and may include a short history of the building. For those properties with limited history, a simple sign identifying it as a "Local Heritage Place" or "State Heritage Place" will be offered.

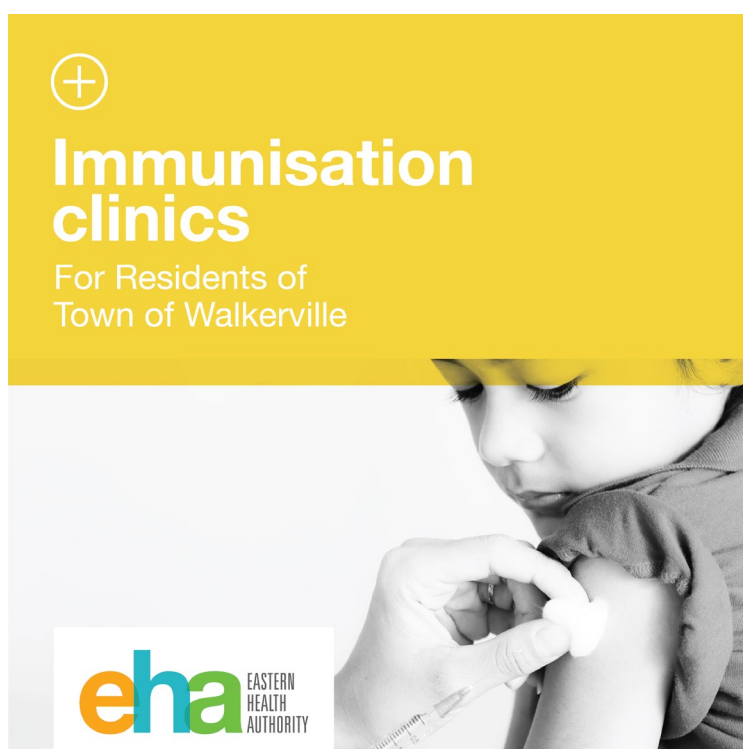

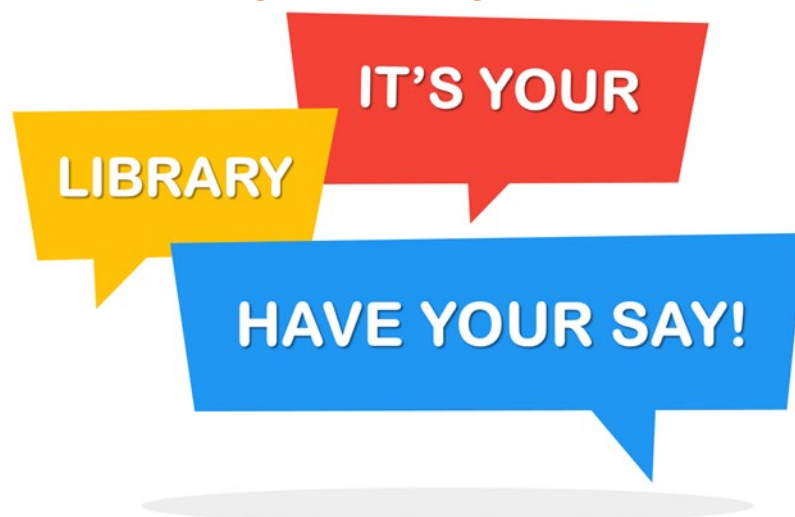

Capital Works Update

Ilford Street Concrete Footpath Renewal.

Council's contractor Nova will commence renewal of the concrete footpath in Ilford Street, Vale Park on **Wednesday 19 February 2020**. Work will commence at North East Road and extend both sides of Ilford Street to Hutton Road. Work will be completed on one side before the other side starts. Residents will be notified beforehand. Traffic controls will be in place. Work will start at 7.00 am and finish by 5 pm each day. Works are expected to be complete within 14 days of commencement.

The rapid response facility at Walkerville Oval

The new shed is nearing completion, with wall and roof cladding installed. Roller doors and concrete interior are due to occur next week.

The contractor, MYKRA Pty Ltd has indicated the new multi-purpose facility will be complete by the end-February 2020, weather permitting.

Street sweeping helps keep the Township clean

Our street sweeping trucks drive by your street approximately every 4 weeks to keep the gutters clean.

This not only keeps our streets looking clean and tidy, it also helps protect our environment by removing leaf litter and debris before they enter the stormwater system. It also reduces the chance of flooding in the event of heavy rain and importantly clean streets ensuring our roads are safe for motorists, cyclists and pedestrians.

Council also runs seasonal programs as required when there is increased leaf and berry fall. Additional sweeping is also undertaken to manage autumn leaf fall within the Township.

At times impacts from weather can slow us down. Recently the extremely hot weather resulted in a dramatic increase in the number of trees dropping their leaves slowing our sweeper down.

Our sweeper also has to stop to spread materials that have been placed into piles. While we appreciate the efforts of residents to pile leaf litter our street sweepers cannot pick up these piles. Leaving the leaf litter spread in the gutter helps keep our sweepers moving.

Our street sweeping programs are seasonally adjusted to effectively manage the level of risk in streets where issues are present generally relating to street tree litter.
