To celebrate, we have a science experiment video you can watch and then try yourself at home.


SPEEDY FISH EXPERIMENT

Open for Consultation

Levi Caravan Park - Proposed Alienation of Community Land (via Lease)

The current lease over the Levi Caravan Park expires 30 November 2020 (**Expiry**) and at its Ordinary Meeting of 20 January 2020, Council resolved to conduct an open expression of interest tender process (**EOI**) to seek out a new Park Operator / Manager.

Following the close of the EOI, a number of submissions were received and Council is currently in the process of short-listing the reputable and experienced candidates with the view that a new successful candidate will be appointed in September 2020.

Council intends to offer the incoming Park Operator / Manager a lease over the site for a term in excess of five (5) years and up to and including 42 years in order to allow the Park Operator / Manager to redevelop the Park for the benefit of both the community and tourists alike.

Council now seeks the community's feedback on the proposal to offer the incoming lessee a long-term lease.



The Town of Walkerville has made the difficult decision to cancel its annual Christmas Fair.



Cat owners who have received a Cat Owner Notice are required to maintain their details annually on www.dogsandcatsonline.com.au by simply checking all details are up to date and completing the free renewal.

Capital Works Update

Drainage Works on Edwin Terrace.

Minor drainage works will occur near the corner of James Street and Edwin Terrace, Gilberton. The works will incorporate a "French Drain" and pipework to prevent sub-surface water damaging the road. The works will commence early next week and take about 2 days to finalise. All work will be carried out in the nature strip and no access issues are expected.

Drainage Works on Park Terrace.

An existing stormwater drain on Park Terrace (main road) has become damaged and blocked due to tree root intrusion. Administration proposed to clean this drain out and re-line with a plastic liner. This work will be commencing next week, from Monday 17 August 2020. Although this methodology occurs regularly, this will be the first time The Town of Walkerville has re-lined an existing stormwater drain in this manner.

Street sweeping helps keep the Township clean

Additional autumn leaf collections have commenced within the township.

Our street sweeping programs are seasonally adjusted to effectively manage the level of risk in streets where issues are present generally relating to street tree litter.

While we make every effort to keep our streets clean year-round, you can help out by doing the following:

- Avoid sweeping leaves or clippings onto the road;
- Do not park caravans, trailers or boats on the road for extended periods.
