#### **Summary**

#### **Background**

Volunteer Awards are held every year and following Council's recommendations are announced by the Mayor of Walkerville at a special volunteer's event to be held in the Walkerville Town Hall on Tuesday 25 May 2021.

#### **Discussion/Issues for Consideration**

Nominations are accepted from everyone in the community. In addition to communicating directly with local schools and community groups, the Awards are promoted via Council's website, social media, weekly round-up and in the last issue of *About Town*. Nominations are assessed against the following criteria:

#### Volunteer of the year:

#### Criteria:

For exceptional voluntary service by an individual who has benefited the Town of Walkerville. This award is only for people aged over 35 years. This award can recognise a volunteer who has worked in the community for a long-period of time, as well as someone who is new to volunteering, but who has

made an outstanding contribution to the Township. The nominee does not need to live in the Township, but must demonstrate a connection to it, through their volunteering activities. Nominations for individuals who live in the Township but who volunteer outside the Council area will be considered.

#### Category 2: Young volunteer of the Year:

#### Criteria:

For exceptional voluntary service by an individual who has benefited the Town of Walkerville. This award is only for people aged 35 years or under. The nominee does not need to live in the Township, but must demonstrate a connection to it, through their volunteering. This award is also open to students from the Town of Walkerville, who have taken part in volunteering, either in their local school, community, or through other volunteering programs.

#### Category 3: Community event of the year:

#### Criteria:

For a local event held between February 2020 and February 2021, that demonstrated a strong local community focus and volunteering element.

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### Tell us why you have nominated this person or community event.

Amber Trappel is a Year 5 student at Walkerville Primary School. She is a passionate and determined young student, and continues to amaze us with her motivation and her numerous achievements, both community and academic. Amber has given her time to help the Walkerville community, especially during the COVID-19 pandemic, and she has also made significant contributions in her local community close to home.

# What are the key achievements of the person or event you are nominating?

Amber helped the local elderly and vulnerable residents of Walkerville during the darkness of the COVID-19 pandemic, through the Send A Smile Project. Through this project, which was an initiative of the Walkerville Library, Amber created some bright and colourful artwork and wrote encouraging letters for the local senior residents, which helped to make them smile and reduce loneliness. A pen pal relationship was formed, which really touched the hearts of some senior residents.

Amber, (and her younger sister, Penny) also took part in creating a lovely image for Walkerville Library's Send A Smile Project, which was featured in the 2021 James Bennett Calendar, titled "Thriving In Lockdown, Engaging With Your Community", which was distributed Australia-wide, and chosen as the overall winner.

Amber has also been making a difference in her local community where she resides in The City Of Port Adelaide Enfield.

Amber wrote a letter to her local Councillor, expressing her views on

cigarette smoking and the environment, for the health of her sister, who has asthma, and for the entire community.

She actively presented and read her letter at a meeting in the Council Chambers.

She has been successful in banning cigarette smoking within 10 metres of play spaces used by children, and new signage will be installed at over 120 sites in this Council area.

Amber's success was reported in National Geographic Kids Magazine, with the intention to inspire other children everywhere to speak up and let their voice be heard. It was also reported in the Walkerville Primary School Newsletter to inspire other Walkerville students and families.

Motivated by such a positive experience, and wanting to help further, Amber, along with her sister, Penny, decided to submit a project under the City Of Burnside's Your Neighbourhood Budget, to place "No Smoking" signs around the very popular Tusmore Park. It was voted on successfully by the Burnside community, and these signs have now been installed.

# Other significant contributions or achievements of the nominated person or event.

Amber is emerging as a leader amongst her peers, and was voted in to service her school as a Student Representative Council Member (SRC), to which her fellow classmates supported her wholeheartedly.

Also within her school, Amber, together with a small group of her school friends, petitioned their School Principal to allow them to ring the old school bell. Amber and her friends manage a roster for ringing the bell at

the correct times each day.

Amber was also featured The City Of Port Adelaide Council's video, "It's Port Adelaide, It's Amber", and she was recognised for her Council contributions with a City Of Port Adelaide Enfield Australia Day Award.

Since then, Amber has formed relationships with several charities to support her community work.

Teaming up with Asthma Australia, she has become an "Asthma Champion" to help promote asthma awareness and the issues with cigarette smoke.

Amber is also passionate about rainforests and saving all wildlife, particularly the endangered Southern Cassowary. She has engaged Rainforest Rescue, based in Queensland, to help raise funds to help them with their work.

Amber has also been inspired by The Town Of Walkerville's Little Street Libraries, that she sees on her way to school. She had the idea to install a Little Street Library at the playground near her own home, in The City Of Port Adelaide Enfield. This has also been successful, and Amber will be helping to host an event to celebrate the launch of this Little Library, and to raise funds for her above chosen charities, in due course.

guidelines and categories

Through its Volunteer Awards, the Town of Walkerville acknowledges the commitment and contribution of local volunteers and community events. By nominating an individual, or an event, you give recognition to the often unsung heroes in our Township.

As part of the volunteer awards there is also a Mayor's Choice Award. The Mayors Choice Award is not open for nomination but the recipient is selected by the Elected Members. Awards are offered in three categories:

#### Category 1: Volunteer of the Year

For exceptional voluntary service by an individual who has benefited the Town of Walkerville. This award is only for people aged over 35 years. This award can recognise a volunteer who has worked in the community for a long-period of time, as well as someone who is new to volunteering, but who has made an outstanding contribution to the Township. The nominee does not need to live in the Township, but must demonstrate a connection to it, through their volunteering activities. Nominations for individuals who live in the Township but who volunteer outside the Council area will be considered.

Individuals can self-nominate for the Volunteer of the Year award.

#### Category 2: Young Volunteer of the Year

For exceptional voluntary service by an individual who has benefited the Town of Walkerville. This award is only for people aged 35 years or under. The nominee does not need to live in the Township, but must demonstrate a connection to it, through their volunteering. This award is also open to students from the Town of Walkerville, who have taken part in volunteering, either in their local school, community, or through other volunteering programs.

Individuals can self-nominate for the Young Volunteer of the Year award.

#### Category 3: Community Event of the Year

For a local event held between February 2020 and February 2021, that demonstrated a strong local community focus and volunteering element.

Organisations can nominate their own events for the Community Event of the Year award.

#### Definition of volunteering:

Volunteering Australia defines volunteering as an activity where individuals choose willingly to work without an expectation of remuneration to provide a service with a community focus.

#### How Council decides?

Nominations (including the Mayor's Choice Award) are determined by the Elected Members of the Town of Walkerville. Their decision is final and no feedback is provided.

Recipients will be announced by the Mayor of Walkerville at a volunteer's event on 25 May 2021.

#### Tell us why you have nominated this person or community event.

During 2020 only one other suburban Art Show was held due to the problems with undertaking events when the severe Covid-19 restrictions were in place. Walkerville Rotary took on the challenge for two main reasons, the first being that the Art Show is a significant event on the Walkerville social calendar and in 2020 we were starved of events. The second was to support the artists who were really 'doing it tough' during Covid and provide them with the showcase and market for their art. 146 of them submitted 460 works for judging and sale. The Walkerville community showed their appreciation by turning up on the opening night and throughout the exhibition week spending time admiring the high standard works on display. They also generously opened their wallets to the tune of over \$30,000 which gladdened the hearts of the successful artists.

The event gave the opportunity to a number of volunteers to assist the Walkerville Rotary team in running an event which provided a great deal of satisfaction and enjoyment to all involved. Several local businesses were also involved in sponsoring financially or in kind contributing significantly to the overall success.

#### What are the key achievements of the person or event you are nominating?

The key achievements of the 2020 Walkerville Art show were:

- 1. Safely providing an important Walkerville social event during Covid-19 restrictions when they were in short supply, involving local volunteers and businesses.
- 2. Meeting the needs of local artists for a market-place at a time when they had considerable difficulty finding an outlet for their work.
- 3. Raising substantial sums which are being used to fund local, national and international community projects giving an impact to the show well beyond the bounds of our local community and indeed our country.
