# FROM THE MAYOR OF WALKERVILLE



A few weeks ago, His Excellency The Honourable Hieu Van Le AC, Governor of South Australia joined me onstage at the Walkerville Town Hall to present the annual 2018 Volunteer of the year awards.

Although many volunteers would say that volunteering is its own reward – it is equally true that local volunteers and volunteer organisations *should* be celebrated and recognised – and that is what the awards are about.

You can read more about the recipients on page two of *About town*.

At the moment Council is in full 'budget' mode.

This will be the final budget our Council delivers prior to the Local Government elections in November 2018.

The experience of working together on developing three consecutive budgets has involved in-depth investigation and learnings. I believe this Council's record for delivering good budget outcomes for our ratepayers stands for itself.

Initially, this Council inherited a budget that had already been adopted and was forecasting a

deficit outcome. However, we were able to identify cost savings and efficiency improvements and the result was a break-even budget. From that point onwards, our focus on every subsequent budget has remained on achieving a positive operating budget and reducing debt.

Our next two budgets in 2015/16 and 2016/17 delivered a small operating surplus.

At this point in time\*, the 2017/18 budget indicates a small deficit. However, by the time we get the end of the financial year it is anticipated that we will

achieve a break-even or possibly a small surplus.

This draft 2018/19 budget – with your input and support – forecasts another positive budget where expenditure does not exceed income revenue and where debt is responsibly managed.

I want to assure our community that when we are presented with unexpected circumstances – such as the impact of China's National Sword Policy, we don't blithely add the costs to the budget and pass them on to ratepayers. In these situations, our approach

is always to look for cost savings and efficiencies first, and where feasible, to reprioritise projects in order to achieve our target of a balanced budget.

**I am inviting our community to be part of a productive and robust conversation and to focus that conversation on the specific projects and services proposed in the budget.**

As you will see from this issue of *About town*, our recent Town wide survey showed a high satisfaction rating for living in the Town of Walkerville. 91% of residents who took part in the survey responded that they were very satisfied or satisfied with living here – and they attributed their satisfaction levels to the following:

1. having a range of open spaces, such as parks, gardens and playgrounds
2. the visual presentation and tidiness of the Township
3. ease of travelling and moving within the Township for pedestrians, motorists and cyclists.

That 91% satisfaction rating doesn't just happen without a plan. During the last three budget cycles, Council has strategically invested and focused attention on these priority areas with Townwide beautification programs, increased traffic control mechanisms and significant road and footpath upgrades.

In this context, where – and how – we direct funds and select projects has a direct correlation to the wellbeing of people in our community – and that's why your participation in the budget consultation process can really make a difference.



**Down every street**

**Clisby Street, Vale Park**



**Clisby Street is named after Leslie (Les) Redford Clisby, DFC (1914 – 1940)**

Leslie Clisby grew up in Angas Ave, Vale Park and became Australia's first fighter ace in World War 2 and the first RAAF ace to be lost in action.

He was credited with sixteen aerial victories before being killed

in action during the Battle of France in May 1940. In a combat career lasting a matter of months, he was Australia's first ace of the war.

He died aged 25, never knowing he had been awarded the Distinguished Flyer Cross and is buried in the military cemetery at Choloy in north-eastern France.

An RAF pilot said of him **"He was an Australian... and had thrown himself with a reckless abandon that was magnificent in its way"**

# Surveying the scene

## TOWN-WIDE CUSTOMER SATISFACTION SURVEY

Our recent Town-wide customer satisfaction survey provided greater insight around community satisfaction levels with the Township and the Council. The aim of the survey is to provide a benchmark to

guide strategic planning and to measure community perceptions about living in the Town of Walkerville. It also gives Council a good indication of how it is tracking in delivering services in key focal areas.

Below are some of the findings:

**Satisfaction ratings:**

**91%**  
of residents surveyed were satisfied/very satisfied with living in the Town of Walkerville.

**63%**  
were satisfied/very satisfied with Walkerville Terrace as a retail precinct.

**68%**  
were satisfied/very satisfied with Council's customer service

**68%**  
were satisfied/very satisfied with the availability of on-street parking.

**79%**  
said they did not want to pay a nominal amount for parking

**74%**  
rate their access to the Linear Park Trail as good or very good

**Making contact:**

**50%**  
of those surveyed had had some sort of contact with the Council in the previous 12 months

**36%**  
by phone

**31%**  
in person at the Civic and Community Centre

**19%**  
via email

**82%**  
of people surveyed were aware of About Town and 68% of residents think it is a useful way of finding out about Council's activities

**63%**  
of respondents said they were aware that Council regularly seeks feedback and in the last 12 months, 1 in 3 residents have provided feedback to Council on a proposed project or decision.

**Top three priorities for residents:**

**1. 94%**  
of respondents rated having a range of public open spaces, such as parks, gardens and playgrounds as their top priority.

**2. 94%**  
of respondents rated the visual presentation of the Township i.e tidy streets, lots of trees etc

**3. 93%**  
rated ease of travelling and moving within the Township, whether by foot, bike or car as important to them

Approximately 8 out of 10 residents surveyed are satisfied with Council's performance in these three priority areas.

## 2018 Council elections

Councils are part of the democratic framework of Australia. Communities elect their council members every four years and the next Council election is in November 2018.

Unlike State and Federal elections, it is not compulsory to vote. However, Councils make decisions that impact on most aspects of our daily lives – so be part of the most significant single voluntary civic

participation activity in the State. In 2014, 360,000 people voted in the council elections and Walkerville has consistently had a high response rate (per capita) at election time.

## Explaining cats & dogs

New laws for cat and dog owners will come into effect on 1 July 2018. These new laws and rules will simplify dog registration process, make it easier to reunite lost dogs and cats with their owners, help identify and put a stop to puppy farms and reduce euthanasia rates. For more information regarding the changes visit [www.dogandcatboard.com.au](http://www.dogandcatboard.com.au)

**From 1 July 2018, Dogs and Cats Online will be the central database for:**

- microchipped and registered dogs and cats
- registration payments
- register of breeders.

Existing dog owners should receive a renewal notice during July 2018 with their dog's new lifetime registration disc (replacing the annual disc) and instructions on how to complete their annual dog registration online. If you do not receive a renewal notice, please contact the Council.

### Microchipping

From 1 July, owners must microchip their dogs and cats by 12 weeks of age or at the point of the sale.

Veterinarians may be exempt an animal for medical reasons. Owners are encouraged to take advantage of the numerous discount microchipping days. Visit [www.chiplitz.com](http://www.chiplitz.com) for upcoming dates.

### Desexing

All dogs and cats born after the 1 July 2018 must be desexed by 6 months of age or 28 days after purchase by the owner (whichever is the later). Working livestock dogs are not required to be desexed, however they will need to be microchipped.

### Breeders

People who breed dogs and cats for sale after 1 July 2018 must register with the Dog and Cat Management Board as a breeder. Your breeder registration number must be included in all advertisements for a dogs and cats. There are new requirements to disclose the breeder registration number and other information to the buyer at the point of sale. All breeders are required to follow the new industry standards and guidelines.

## Street libraries

Some may see them as a wooden box filled with books – but we prefer to think of them as 'a symbol of trust and hope – a tiny vestibule of literary happiness.'\*

**The premise of street libraries is simple:** There are no checkouts or library cards, simply pick a

book that takes your fancy and when you're finished return it to any of the street libraries.

If you can't receive bills electronically, fee exemptions may be available if you:

- » are a senior
- » are registered for a concession
- » receive income support or
- » don't have internet access.

- 2 Ask about their exemption criteria and how to apply.
