Service changes for Easter

Due to the upcoming Easter long weekend, from Friday 7 April 2023 to Monday 10 April 2023, a number of services will change to accommodate the public holidays.

The Civic and Community Centre – including Walkerville Library - will be closed from 5pm on Thursday 6 April 2023 and reopen at 9am on Tuesday 11 April 2023.

Bin collections will change for some residents in the Council area for this public holiday weekend. People who have Friday bin collections will instead have their bins collected on Saturday 8 April 2023.

However, Monday bin collection will continue as normal on 10 April 2023.

Nottage Terrace and North East Road Upgrade

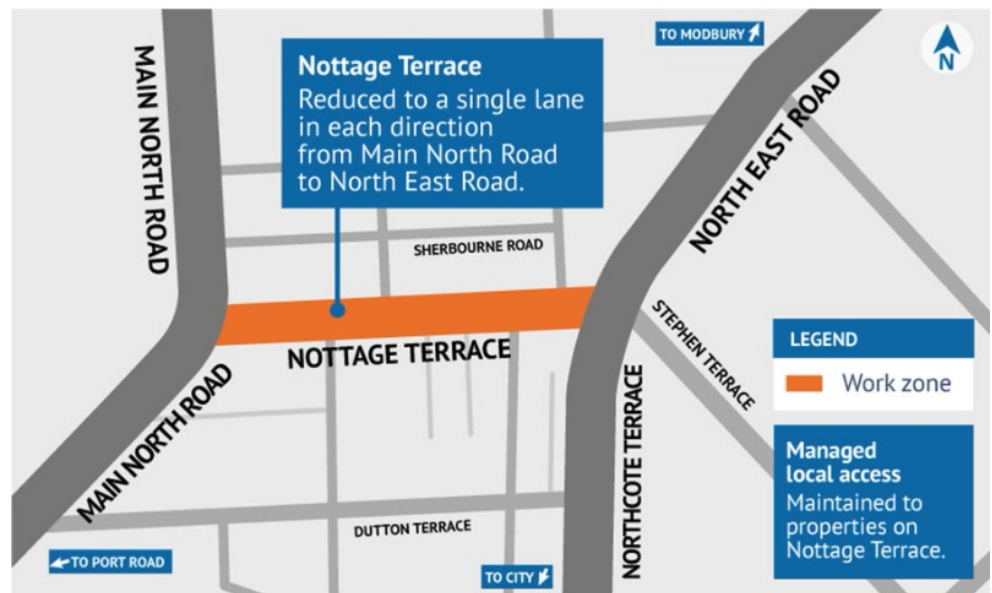
There will be temporary traffic changes to the Nottage Terrace and North East Road intersection.

Nottage Terrace will be reduced to one lane in each direction during night shifts on Sunday 26 March and Monday 27 March 2023, between 7pm to 6am, weather permitting. This is required to replace existing asphalt along Nottage Terrace.

There will be some short-term access impacts to adjacent side streets and to properties on Nottage Terrace and Ettrick Avenue in the work area, during these works. The project team will contact affected property owners and residents directly. Traffic controllers will be onsite to facilitate local access and detour signage will be in place.

Pedestrians and cyclists are advised to take care when travelling through the area.

The following traffic arrangements will be in place during night shifts from Tuesday 28 March and Wednesday 29 March 2023, to lay the final wearing course of asphalt on the western side of the intersection of North East Road and along Nottage Terrace between the intersection and Victoria Road:



- Nottage Terrace will be reduced to eastbound traffic only;
- Local access will be maintained to both sides of Nottage Terrace; and
- No access to westbound lanes of Nottage Terrace at its intersection with North East Road/ Northcote Terrace and Stephen Terrace, detour via main arterial roads.

The following traffic arrangements will be in place during night shift from Thursday 30 March 2023, to lay the final wearing course of asphalt on the eastern side of the intersection of North East Road:

- Eastbound lanes of Stephen Terrace will be closed at the intersection of North East Road;
- Traffic traveling on North East Road and Nottage Terrace wanting to access Stephen Terrace will be detoured via Northcote Terrace and Walkerville Terrace;
- Traffic coming from North Adelaide wanting to access Stephens Terrace will be detoured via Walkerville Terrace; and
- Local traffic will have access to the eastbound lanes on Stephen Terrace east of the intersection of North East Road and Northcote Terrace.



Traffic controllers will be onsite to assist local access and detour signage will be in place. Pedestrians and cyclists are advised to take care when travelling through the area. Emergency services vehicle access will be maintained at all times.

Some noise disturbances can be expected at times while these works are completed, however, the work will be managed to minimise disturbance to nearby residents as much as practically possible. This includes scheduling more intrusive works in the early evening where possible. You may also notice some odour which is common when asphaltting works are underway.

River Torrens Linear Park Shared Path Enhancement: Stage 2

Staged path section closures.

The River Torrens Linear Park Path is being enhanced to provide a safer and more enjoyable experience for recreational users.

The project includes:

- Reconstruction of the shared path along the River Torrens Linear Park between the intersection of Battams Road / Ninth Avenue, Royston Park, to the east and St Peters River Park to the west;
- A new 2.5 kilometre, 3.0-3.5 metre wide shared path;
- Wayfinding and signage to improve the ability for people to find their way to key destinations; and
- LED lighting that is fully compliant with Austroads Guidelines and Australian Standards.



During construction, sections of the path will be closed and suitable diversions will be provided for pedestrians and cyclists.

The first stage (Stage 1) of the project will commence at Harrow Road and progress towards Player Avenue.

During this first stage of the project, a full detour of the path will be required which includes closure of the Gilberton Swing Bridge.

Works on Stage 1 are scheduled to commence on Monday 27 March 2023 and continue until late May 2023.

Council's Group Manager Public Relations & Community Services Sarah Spencer said it would be great to gauge feedback in order to understand current community perception, following the last survey in 2019.

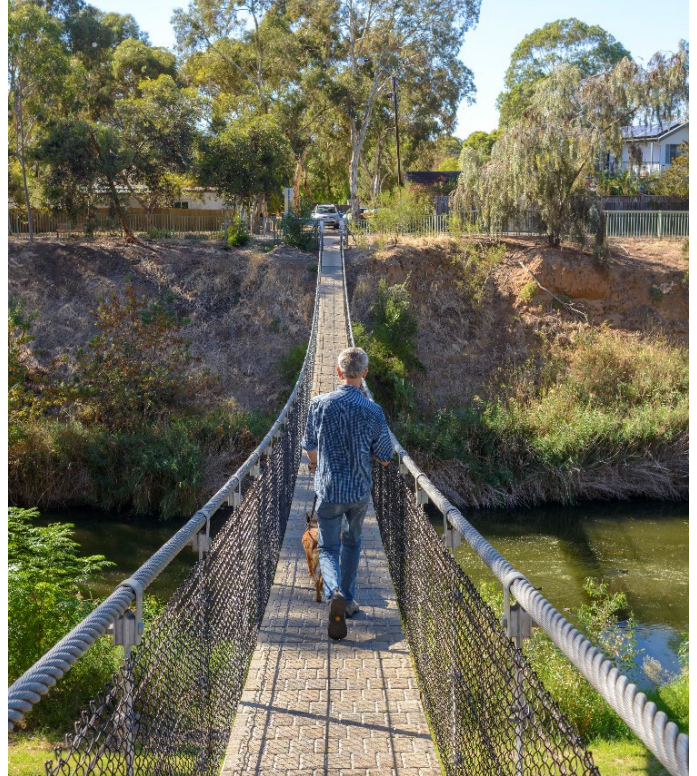

Volunteer of the Year nominations now open

Nominate a deserving person today for the 2023 Volunteer Awards!

Council is encouraging people to nominate a deserving volunteer in our community by putting their name forward for an individual or local community event in the 2023 Volunteer Awards.

There are three volunteer award categories, plus a Mayor's Choice Award category – with a recipient selected by Elected Members.

The below categories are:

Category 1: Volunteer of the Year

For exceptional voluntary service by an individual who has benefited the Town of Walkerville. This award is only for people aged over 35 years. This award can recognise a volunteer who has worked in the community for a long period of time, as well as someone who is new to volunteering but who has made an outstanding contribution to the Township. The nominee does not need to live in the Township, but must demonstrate a connection to it through their volunteering activities. Nominations for individuals who live in the Township, but who volunteer outside the Council area, will be considered. Individuals can self-nominate for the Volunteer of the Year Award.

Category 2: Young Volunteer of the Year

For exceptional voluntary service by an individual who has benefited the Town of Walkerville. This award is only for people aged 35 years or under. The nominee does not need to live in the Township, but must demonstrate a connection to it through their volunteering.

This award is also open to students from the Town of Walkerville who have taken part in volunteering, either in their local school, community, or through other volunteering programs. Individuals can self-nominate for the Young Volunteer of the Year Award.

Category 3: Community Event of the Year (this can be in-person or virtual)

For a local event held between February 2022 and February 2023 that demonstrated a strong local community focus and volunteering element. Organisations can nominate their own events for the Community Event of the Year Award.

Category 4: Mayor's Choice Award

The Mayor's Choice Award is not open for receiving nominations, as the recipient will be selected by Elected Members. This Award is given to a deserving volunteer, who has been noticed by the Elected Members for their hard work and passion.

Nominations open at 9am on Friday 10 March 2023 and close at 5pm on Monday 3 April 2023.

How does Council decide?

Award recipients are selected by the Town of Walkerville Elected Members. Their decision is final and no feedback is provided to the nominator.

Council also presents a Mayor's Choice Award, which will not receive nominations as the winner is nominated and selected by Elected Members.

Winners will be announced by the Mayor of Walkerville, Melissa Jones, at the Volunteer Awards presentation event on Thursday 18 May 2023.

Be prepared for National Ride2School Day

National Ride2School Day is today (Friday 24 March 2023) with students across South Australia riding, walking, scooting or skating their way to school.

Across Australia, more than 350,000 students will be out on the streets and roads on differing modes of transport to celebrate active travel.

While this day encourages students to embrace a healthy start to the day, people who live or travel through the Township are encouraged to keep an eye out and be safe while driving.

The Bicycle Network, organisers of the National Ride2School Day, have some handy tips of safely driving with other modes of transport, like bikes or scooters:



- Look before opening a car door.
- When turning left, always check the bike lane and the side of your car for bicycle riders.
- When turning right at an intersection, or on to a side street or driveway, watch out for hidden bike riders who are travelling with the opposite traffic.
- Be mindful of parked cars, as some bicycle riders will need to ride around these vehicles if parked near or on a bicycle lane.

Let's reminisce: shop & attached house, 109 Walkerville Terrace, Walkerville

The shop and attached house at 109 Walkerville Terrace, Walkerville, is understood to have been constructed in 1908.

Earliest identified lands title records date to 1891 when the original allotment (Lot 42) was owned by the Malone family.



109 Walkerville Terrace, Walkerville, photographed in 1989.

Town of Walkerville rate assessment records indicate the presence of a three-roomed cottage on Lot 42 at this time, though the site was described as 'unoccupied' (ie. a vacant building site) from 1898.

In 1902, Lot 42 was purchased by Julia Jane Boyce, wife of Samuel Boyce, a prominent local builder. The allotment was then subdivided, forming the sites of 109 & 111 Walkerville Terrace.

In 1903, the site of 109 Walkerville Terrace was acquired by James Tonkin of Walkerville, a bootmaker.

Rate assessment records indicate the site remained vacant until 1908, when a 'shop and dwelling in course of erection' was described and completed by the following year.

It is understood that Tonkin's bootmaking business, previously run from rented accommodation on the corner of Stephen Terrace and Williams Street (now Walkerville Terrace), occupied the new building from this time.

The site was owned by the Tonkin family for a time and was used by the Savings Bank of South Australia from 1946.

Later owned by the Greenlees family, the site is currently used as offices.

The shop and attached house have been described as an integral part of the Walkerville Terrace heritage streetscape, contributing strongly to the precinct's 'village character'.

109 Walkerville Terrace, Walkerville was entered into the South Australian Heritage Register as a Local Heritage place on 8th February 2007.

This throwback is part of the Town of Walkerville's historic plaque initiative. If you are interested in having a plaque installed at your property, please contact the Planning Team on 8342 7100.

To be eligible, the property must be listed as a Heritage Place. Plaques are manufactured and installed free of charge by an experienced stone mason engaged by Council.

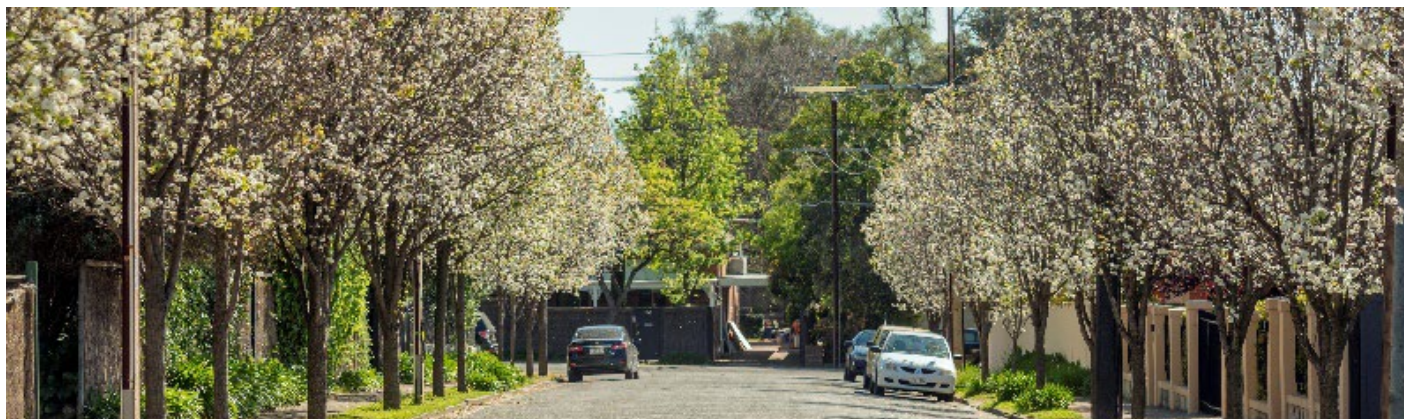
