FROM THE MAYOR OF WALKERVILLE

We are now well and truly into 2024 – and I want to wish everyone in our community a very happy New Year.

This year is shaping up to be one of the biggest years in recent memory for the Town of Walkerville. Our major projects are starting to take shape, and a Major Projects Advisory Committee, with a mix of Council and independent members, will advise on the delivery of those key redevelopments. There is tangible progress on plans for both 39 Smith Street and the Walkerville Bowling & Community Club - as Council prepares to go to tender for these sites. For the broader Walkerville Oval precinct, Council recently consulted on sports and infrastructure improvements, including new oval lighting, multi-sport community court area, new cricket nets, public toilet, picnic shelter and barbecue. Consultation results are available in the overturned pages of this newsletter.

Apart from the major projects, Council will be embarking on a new Strategic Plan, which will cover a period of 10 years.

We have called it **TOWards2035**, and Council is very keen to have feedback from the community to make sure the Plan is robust and really embodies what the community's vision is for our Village over the next decade.

As a lead-in to the Strategic Plan and following the recent high profile, crime-related events in our neighbourhood, at our January Council meeting, Council resolved that a 'Community Safety' plan be prepared that integrates principles and initiatives that will help to improve the safety and security of our residents. This may include public awareness and information, CCTV and/or community safety grant opportunities, environmental design for crime prevention and cross-agency collaboration. Council will consider the envisioned 'Community Safety' plan as part of our new Strategic Plan.

Please look out for communications on TOWards2035, and, more importantly, please provide your feedback.

In terms of communications, there are many ways you can keep up to date on Council

happenings and news. Subscribing to the weekly e-news - "Weekly Round Up" - is a fantastic way to learn about open consultations, as well as other events, projects and initiatives happening in the Township. You can sign up by visiting: walkerville.sa.gov.au/subscribe

Alternatively, Council's website and the Town of Walkerville Facebook page have regular updates, including a new segment called the 'Mayor's Minute', where I will provide a brief video update on exciting news and Council decisions each month. Your feedback is important and

we don't want you to miss any news or consultations, so please sign up to stay connected with Council.

Lastly, Council has consulted on its Code of Practice to allow the community to come into Council meetings and ask questions without notice.

This will enable greater transparency and I hope will encourage greater community participation in our meetings. Council meets at 7pm on the third Monday of each month, and the community is welcome to watch from the gallery or ask questions at the beginning of the meeting. Council was expected to endorse the new Code at its February meeting, after printing of this edition of About Town.

I was again thrilled to present citizenship to 18 new Australians living in our community at the Australia Day citizenship ceremony. This year, Council also awarded Citizen of the Year Awards to people in our community who have made a wonderful impact on our Township through either being outstanding citizens or for amazing projects, events and initiatives. You can read more about those awards later in this newsletter.

Citizen of the Year Award winners

At the Australia Day citizenship ceremony, the Town of Walkerville unveiled the winners of the Citizen of the Year Awards for the Township.

Council received nominations in three categories - Citizen of the Year, Young Citizen of the Year and Active Citizenship.

The winner of the Citizen of the Year Award was **Annie Hutchinson**, for her dedicated service to the community through the Friends of Walkerville Primary School - a member since 2017, Vice President from 2018 and President

from 2021-23. She led the way in raising \$73,500 in funding for a nature playground at the school. Her voluntary service with the Committee has provided great benefit to teachers, students, parents, grandparents, families and friends. Annie also continued the "Walky Spirit" throughout the peak of COVID-19 to assist the community in re-engaging with each other.

Eighteen-year-old **Jessica Craig** won the Young Citizen of the Year Award for contributions to her school, Wilderness, and the wider community. Jessica was the Vice President of the Student Representative Council and worked hard to create an inclusive school environment. She volunteered weekly with foster care children in the 'Fun in the Wilderness' program, as well as caring for children living with disability through SONY Foundation Camp. Jessica also volunteered in Ethiopia in the Catherine Hamlin Hospital.

The Walkerville Bushcare Volunteers group won the Award for Active Citizenship for their three decades of work restoring, regenerating and maintaining many sites along the Linear Park River Torrens area. This group has beautified the area while protecting and bolstering the Township's biodiversity.

A special mention to nominees: SA Youth Guitar Ensemble, Eloise Broster and Claudia John.

Consultation on Walkerville Oval Open Space

The Town of Walkerville recently consulted the community on a proposed upgrade to the Walkerville Oval precinct.

The following upgrades were proposed:

- Walkerville Oval lighting & electrical infrastructure;
- A multi-sport community court area with lighting, featuring line marking & match-compliant runoff for netball, basketball & tennis. The current courts would be reduced to one court;
- Cricket practice nets featuring six synthetic pitches for public use & two turf pitches to be used and maintained by the Walkerville Cricket Club;
- 10m x 4m shelter with two picnic tables/ seating & barbecue, with an accessible path linking through to Alfred Street; and
- Public toilet (Exeloo).

The proposal aimed to upgrade the surrounding areas around the Walkerville Oval, while also making the space safer and more compliant for everyday users.

Council was thrilled to have received more than 50 responses on its proposal. Following consultation, Council revised the proposal to reflect community feedback and Members were expected to consider the updated plan at the 19 February Ordinary Council Meeting, after printing of this edition of About Town.

Major projects update

The Town of Walkerville is currently in the process of planning for four major projects – Walkerville Sports Club, Walkerville Oval Open Space, Walkerville Bowling & Community Club and 39 Smith Street Recreation Centre. These four developments will collectively be the largest in the history of Council – with the aim to create a modern sports and community hub within the Township through the upgrade of the Walkerville Oval precinct and the 39 Smith Street Recreation Centre.

The delivery of these projects has been on Council's agenda for a number of years and a major hurdle has been affordability.

After careful consideration of finances, engagement with stakeholders and site investigations, Council is embarking on a new way

forward to ensure all projects can be responsibly delivered.

In November, Council held a Special Meeting to make a decision on its major projects. Council Members unanimously supported:

- A new build for the Walkerville Bowling & Community Club building;

- New Walkerville Oval lighting, tennis/netball courts & cricket practice nets;
- Going to market to investigate both a 'refurbishment' option & a 'new build' option for the 39 Smith Street Recreation Centre; and
- A renovation for the Walkerville Sports Club building.

As these projects progress, keep an eye out for consultations on the different aspects of the plan.

Belt Reserve upgrade finalised

The Town of Walkerville recently upgraded Belt Reserve in Walkerville, taking inspiration from the 175th anniversary of St Andrew's Church.

This minor landscaping upgrade included the installation of a small shelter, new bench seat, brick feature pillars, exposed aggregate concrete pad, new paving in the shape of a cross, and plants.

Reverend Stuart Langshaw, locum at St Andrew's Church, said the congregation is happy with the upgrade to the reserve, which reflects well on that picturesque part of Walkerville.

"To have this new paving that celebrates the 175th [milestone] is recognition of all St Andrew's has stood for over those years," said Reverend Langshaw.

Vale Park is home to Australia's most recent DanceSport stars with Miriam and David Amos taking out the top spot in the 'Master 3 Open New Vogue - over 60s category' at the Dance Sport Championships in Melbourne.

The category involves completing five different sequence dances in the style of the foxtrot, tango and Viennese waltz.

The pair were also able to dance their way to second place in their second event, the 'Master 3 Open Standard - over 60s category', which includes completing five ballroom dance styles of waltz, tango, Viennese waltz, foxtrot and quickstep.

The husband-and-wife team have been ballroom dancing since their 20s, hoping one day they would be able to become Australian champions - which they have now achieved!

Mrs Amos said, "For us, the feelings we felt are those that are written in the lyrics to the song *This is the Moment*, the main song from the 1990s musical *Jekyll & Hyde*.

"After years of lessons, practice and coaching in steps, technique, musicality, grooming and presentation, and often pushing through injuries, it all came to climax when we were announced as the winners."

While the Amos' reached their goal of becoming Australian champions in DanceSport at the December event, this is definitely not the end for their dancing careers. The pair will be competing in several competitions both nationally and internationally over 2024.

Their next competition will be held in Adelaide on Sunday, 17 March 2024, at the Adelaide Spectacular, which is part of the Adelaide Fringe.

Following this, the pair will be flying over to Blackpool in the UK to compete in the Blackpool World Dance Festival in the over 50s Ballroom event.

Mrs Amos said they hope to place higher in this competition compared to last year and become world champions too.

Doing it the Walkerville way

For Pat and Rob McPhedran, the past 20 years running the Walkerville Post Office have been so much more than just business.

The post office is an important community hub for the Township and Mrs McPhedran has found that her and her husband, Rob, and her sons, Malcolm and Steven, often wear many hats outside of the normal requirements of a postal worker - including confidant, charitable volunteer and friend.

"The customer relations is what we have most enjoyed about the business," said Mrs McPhedran. "[People] can come in and tell you about their little dog or their family.

"It's a community shop. It has been the little things for us!

"We often have people accidentally leave things in the shop, like wallets, and the boys are happy to get in the car and drive it home to the right person. It's all part of the job."

Mrs McPhedran said that while the post office tasks are important, taking care of the customers has always been a priority - something that was recognised by the Rotary Club of Walkerville, who awarded the business with a Quality of Service Award in 2016 - a crowning achievement for Mrs McPhedran.

In agreeance, Mr McPhedran added that working at the post office in Walkerville has been a good and challenging experience, and being able

to have jokes with local people has made their time in the Township all the more enjoyable.

The new owners of the post office have big shoes to fill, however, Mrs McPhedran confirms that the new owners are trained in serving the community in "the Walkerville way".

Mr and Mrs McPhedran, and Malcolm and Steven, will remember their time at the post office fondly, with the whole family saying they are going to miss the people of

Walkerville the most. The decision to sell up shop to explore retirement has been a hard one for the family, however, Mr and Mrs McPhedran are excited to go on their five-month Western Australia caravan trip, and Malcolm and Steven are looking forward to new opportunities.

All the McPhedran family asks is that the Township gives a proper Walkervillian welcome to the new owners of the Walkerville Post Office.






