Title: Request to Bury Ashes

Pursuant to Section 83(5) of the *Local Government Act 1999*, the Chief Executive Officer indicates that the matter contained in this report may, if the Council so determines, be considered in confidence pursuant to Section 90(2) of the *Local Government Act 1999* on the basis that the information contained in the attached report is information of the nature specified in subsections 90(3)(a) of the Act being:

information the disclosure of which would involve the unreasonable disclosure of information concerning the personal affairs of any person (living or dead)

## **Recommendation (Public)**

## Pursuant to s90(3)(a)

Pursuant to section 90(2) of the *Local Government Act 1999* the Council orders that all members of the public, except Council's Chief Executive Officer, Kiki Magro, General Manager, Heather Barclay & Protocol Compliance & Governance Officer, Deb Bria be excluded from attendance at the meeting for Agenda Item entitled Request to Bury Ashes

The Council is satisfied that, pursuant to section 90(3)(a) of the Act, the information to be received, discussed or considered in relation to this Agenda Item is information the disclosure of which would involve the unreasonable disclosure of information concerning the personal affairs of any person (living or dead), being Mr Graham Mussared.

The Council is satisfied that the principle that the meeting be conducted in a place open to the public has been outweighed in the circumstances because disclosure of details may prematurely be disclosed before the details have been discussed with Mrs Mussared.

#### Summary

A request has been received to bury ashes under a tree along the Linear Park within the Council area Pursuant to Council's Local Government Land By-Law 2015, the request is presented to Council for consideration and determination.

#### **Background**

Correspondence has been received from Mrs Mussared seeking approval to place the ashes of her late husband, Dr Graham Mussared under a tree along the Linear Park within the Council area. (Attachment A).

Mrs Mussared's request states that Mr Mussared lived in Vale Park for over 40 years. In reviewing Council records, Administration can confirm that Mr Mussared purchased a property in Vale Park in 1972 additional to this in 1974 also purchased and operated a Medical Clinic on Northcote Tce Gilberton prior to relocating to Walkerville Tce.

#### **Discussion/Issues for Consideration**

Council's Local Government Land By Law 2015, adopted by Council at its 20 July 2015 Ordinary meeting, in part stipulates the following:

Part 2 Management of Local Government Land

### 4. Activities requiring permission

A person must not on any local government land, without the permission of Council

### 4.19 Funerals and scattering ashes

Conduct or participate in a funeral ceremony or scatter ashes on land to which the Council has resolved this sub-paragraph will apply.

To date Council has not had cause to determine criteria in regards to clause 4.19.

In light of the above, the request is provided to Council for consideration.

Statistical information to date, indicates that 85% of the population are now being cremated and should this request be approved it may set a precedent for future applications, recognising that the Linear Park is a public space, well utilised for social gatherings.

It is also important to note that the Linear Park is under the care and control of Council with land ownership being with the State Government. However, Councils By-Law continues to apply.

The request from Mrs Mussared is approved and Administration writes to inform Mrs Mussared of the outcome.

The request is refused and Administration writes to inform Mrs Mussared of the outcome.
