


## Have your say on the Draft 2023/24 Annual Business Plan

Council's Draft 2023/24 Annual Business Plan has been developed to deliver services, facilities and programs that support our community and businesses over the next financial year.

As part of the planning process, the Town of Walkerville community is invited to provide feedback on the draft plan for 2023/24.

The Draft 2023/24 Annual Business Plan will be funded by a proposed average residential rate increase of 6.9% (excluding growth). which is below the rate of inflation over the past 12 months and at the lower end of the projected rate rises in Councils South across Australia.



This Annual Business Plan will continue Council's excellent maintenance of parks and gardens, progress our road and footpath renewal program, create new event and activity opportunities with the Township, and continue public consultation on important projects, policies, and initiatives.

At a Special Council Meeting on Monday, 5 June 2023, Elected Members endorsed the Draft Annual Business Plan for consultation. The full Council report can be viewed on the <u>Council website</u>.



The consultation for the Annual Business Plan opened at 9am on Thursday, 8 June 2023, and closes at 5pm on Friday, 7 July 2023.

All submissions will be considered by Council at the Ordinary Meeting of Monday, 17 July 2023, in accordance with Council's Public Consultation Policy.

#### Asset Management Plan

(Page 28 and 29 of the Draft 2023/24 Annual Business Plan)

The majority of funding across each asset class for Council-owned infrastructure remains steady across the 10-year funding program to maintain current service levels, with the following exceptions:

- Roads 2025-2028 Roads renewal funding slightly increases over these years to compensate for a reduction in the roads program in 2022-2024 to assist with funding of major strategic projects. This funding increase will help get Council road renewal back to the current service standard provided to the Township and allow the program to return to a more consistent funding model from 2028-2029.
- Plant and Equipment 2023-2025 There is an increase in funding over two financial years as two major pieces of plant have reached their end of useful life in those years.
- Buildings 2024-2026 There is a significant increase in funding over these two financial years due to anticipated additional work required in relation to the Walkerville Oval redevelopment and 39 Smith Street refurbishment, which is not covered by the relevant grant funding.

## Preparations underway for Township street tree program

More than 120 street trees are planned for planting this year around the Town of Walkerville.

Council's field team is in the process of planting a multitude of new street trees across the Township in a variety of locations, as part of its commitment to Council's Urban Forest Strategy.

Some residents have received a notification this week that they will be receiving a new street tree out the front of their property.





The development of the street tree program is a detailed process where Council's field staff map potential planting spaces across the Township to try to improve the local urban forest within a confined urban environment.

### Considerations that are taken into account when selecting planting spaces and tree species include:

- Likelihood of species success
- Surrounding tree species
- Underground and above ground services
- Surrounding infrastructure
- Maximising canopy cover and cooling
- Setbacks from properties and driveways

#### Why is it important to establish and maintain a healthy street tree stock? Street trees can:

- Reduce energy costs for buildings shaded by trees;
- Increase property values for houses on leafy tree-lined streets;
- Contribute to stormwater management by filtering rainwater and slowing runoff;
- Absorb odours and air pollutants;
- Increase native habitat and supporting wildlife conservation;
- Enhance community wellbeing spending time around trees can reduce stress and anxiety, and increase happiness and productivity.

Planting is will commence this month (June 2023).

Residents are reminded that it is an offence to damage or vandalise street trees.

If you have any objections to a proposed street tree out the front of your property, please contact Council in writing, <u>walkerville@walkerville.sa.gov.au</u>, as soon as possible so that the matter can be reviewed prior to planting.



### **Greening Ascot Avenue**

Town of Walkerville will be commencing landscaping works along the northern verge of Ascot Avenue, near the intersection with Harris Road in Vale Park, the week beginning Monday, 5 June 2023.



In 2022, this area was beautified with the addition of a 100m-long mural by Street Artist Marciano Arents of Senman Creations.

With the addition of verge-side planting, this area will soon become a lush and welcoming gateway into the Town of Walkerville.

The proposed landscaping will include an extensive variety of plant species, colours and textures to compliment the artistic mural. The existing concrete footpath, which runs through the site, will also be renewed as part of the project.

Works are expected to take approximately six weeks.







### Supporting our local libraries

With the upcoming State Budget getting closer, local councils are campaigning to encourage the State Government to include annual indexation for libraries to keep things running smoothly.

Local councils invest \$86 million each year into libraries, but the current State Government deal will see local libraries lose \$16 million over five years due to annual indexation.

This could lead to cuts to books and programs, shorter opening hours and fewer staff on hand.

South Australian libraries provide lots of valuable services, including:

 Knowledge and education: Local libraries offer a wealth of resources – from books and magazines to digital tools and online courses – fostering learning and bridging access to opportunities for the community.



- Community wellbeing: Libraries serve as inclusive gathering places, where people of all ages can connect, share ideas and find support.
- Hours of entertainment: With a vast range of digital services including eBooks, audiobooks, music, films and streaming options, local libraries provide endless entertainment options for everyone to enjoy.






