### **Buckingham Arms redevelopment**

Consultation is open on the proposed plan to redevelop the Buckingham Arms site.

The State Government is currently considering the plan to revitalise the Buckingham Arms site.

The proposal includes the construction of а mixed-use storey featuring building. 180 approximately apartments, four-level office building and basement carparking.



The Buckingham Arms is a Local Heritage Listed Place and will remain in its current form, however development is proposed to occur around the site (as pictured in the concept above).

Community consultation on the proposed development is now open and closes on Thursday, 19 October 2023.

The application is being assessed by the State Government, which means Council is not the relevant assessing authority and therefore has limited influence in the outcome. Council encourages the community to submit their feedback to PlanSA.

The State Government approved the rezoning of the Buckingham Arms Hotel site located at 1 Walkerville Terrace, Gilberton - in 2022. This resulted in the transition of the land from a Local Activity Centre Zone to an Urban Corridor (Living) Zone, which meant a greater opportunity for the development of a high-intensity, vibrant, mixed use corridor, with various housing choices and a range of complementary retail and commercial activities.

On 25 November 2022, at the applicant's request, the Minister for Planning "called in" the redevelopment application for the site, meaning the application bypassed Council and the State Government's State Commission Assessment panel (SCAP) was appointed as the relevant authority for assessment. Consequently, Council's role is limited to that of a referral body.

Council has provided its comments to the SCAP, raising concerns regarding the following issues:

- Stormwater management;
- Traffic management;
- Waste management; and
- Heritage impacts.

The public notification process has now commenced and allows the community to provide feedback to the SCAP in relation to either granting or refusing planning consent.

### Walkerville Primary School students learn about the local Township and its fauna

Wildlife expert, James from fauNature, gave a wildlife presentation on Tuesday to Year 4 students and Green Team members at Walkerville Primary School.

Walkerville Primary School was one of the local schools involved in the fauNature and Council wildlife box art project for the 2022 South Australian Living Artists (SALA) Festival.

Students from Walkerville Primary School decorated some of the wildlife boxes last year, which were then installed along the River Torrens and at local reserves.

Following 12 months of action, students were able to learn about the importance of hollows for the local fauna, what animals have been using these boxes as homes and how the students can help take care of the local wildlife.





### Pottery workshop

On Wednesday night, 15 attendees joined in a mindfulness pottery workshop making bowls, cups, pot plants, and much more, out of clay.

After moulding their clay, attendees decorated their bowls, cups and pots with different designs and paintwork.

All of the finished products were taken away to be fired, so they can be regularly used by attendees.

The family yoga sessions have come to an end, however, the sixweek course has provided valuable bonding between parents and their children.

With lots of bending, stretching and joint yoga poses, attendees were able to enjoy relaxing, collaborative exercise sessions over the past six weeks.

### Domestic violence phone drop-off box

Town of Walkerville has a new Domestic Violence (DV) Safe Phone box available to the public for old phone drop-offs in the Grateful Garden of the Civic & Community Centre foyer.

The DV Safe Phone box has been a drop-off location provided by Council for the past two years.

This initiative gives the community the opportunity to donate their old working phones, which can be put to good use.

All discarded phones will be factory wiped, repaired and then provided to domestic violence victims.

In many cases, domestic violence victims may not be able to send messages or make phone calls for help because their current phone



is being monitored or has been taken away by an abusive partner or family member.

These phones give domestic violence victims access to an emergency phone and provide them the opportunity to get help when they need it most.

There are over two million known victims of domestic violence and the DV Safe Phone initiative is one organisation ensuring no call for help goes unanswered.

### **BorrowBox changes**

There have been changes to the BorrowBox subscription from Libraries SA that may impact Walkerville Library users.

BorrowBox is accessible to all Libraries SA members for free, providing a vast range of eBooks and audiobooks.

The One Card Network (Libraries SA) has decided to discontinue offering eMagazines through the BorrowBox app.

While eMagazines will no longer be available through BorrowBox, you still access eMagazines can through the Libby App, which has over 1,000 titles to choose from.

Libby is another service app that is available for One Card Network members. providing eBooks. audiobooks and magazines.

### The Walkerville Wallaby tablet competition closes soon!


Town of Walkerville and the Walkerville Library's Walkerville Wallaby campaign will be closing at 5pm on Friday, 6 October 2023!

### Consultation for a Food Organics & Garden Organics trial in Walkerville closes today

Town of Walkerville is investigating the possibility of undertaking a weekly Food Organics & Garden Organics (FOGO) collections trial in the Township.

This trial would be opt-in for residents and would involve a different bin pick-up schedule.

Instead of the normal 'blue bin once a week' and 'green bin once a fortnight', participants would instead have a collection schedule of 'green bin once a week' and 'blue bin once a fortnight'. The yellow bin would continue to be picked up fortnightly.

A weekly FOGO collection could assist greatly with reducing the cost of waste management in the Council area, while also having a benefit on the environment.



If people in the Township improved their rubbish sorting of food and compostable materials, it could save the community \$96,000 per year.

Residents are always passionate about their bin collection schedule, so Council has gone out to consultation to understand if those who live in the Town of Walkerville have an interest in participating in this trial.

At the <u>Ordinary Council Meeting of 19 June 2023</u>, Council moved a motion to better understand the impacts associated with FOGO bins being collected weekly instead of fortnightly.

The results from this survey - once concluded - will inform a business case for Council about the potential of undertaking a FOGO trial in the next financial year, including the potential costs incurred by Council and the benefits and risks that might be involved with introducing 'Sustainable Kerbside Service'.

### Policies for consultation

Two Council policies are currently out for public consultation - the draft Behavioural Management Policy and the draft Casual Vacancies (Supplementary Elections) Policy.

Both these policies went out to public consultation from 9am on Tuesday, 19 September 2023, and will close at 5pm on Monday, 9 October 2023. These policies were endorsed for consultation at the September Ordinary Meeting of Council.

The new draft **Behavioural Management Policy**, which sets out standards for Council Members behaviour and conduct, was reviewed and updated to meet the recent changes to the Behavioural Management Framework for Council Members, which was implemented on 17 November 2022 by the Local Government Association of South Australia.

This Policy makes it mandatory for all councils to prepare and adopt a Behavioural Management Policy in accordance with Section 262B of the *Local Government Act* 1999.

This draft Behavioural Management Policy sets out the requirements for Council in regard to the management of behaviour of Council Members and the process for receipt and management of a complaint received regarding the conduct of a Council Member.


