Major Projects

The Town of Walkerville is currently in the process of planning for three Major Projects:

- Walkerville Bowling & Community Club;
- 39 Smith Street Recreation Centre: and
- Walkerville Sports Club.







These redevelopments will collectively be the largest in the history of Council – with the aim to create a modern sports and community hub within the Township, through the upgrade of the Walkerville Oval precinct and the 39 Smith Street recreation centre. This will become the heart of activity for the area as it will cater to the many ages, demographics and clubs of the community – both now and long into the future.

The delivery of these projects has been on Council's agenda for a number of years and a major hurdle has been affordability. The vulnerability of the building industry and Council's current Long Term Financial Plan (LTFP) have limited the ability to progress as originally planned.

After careful consideration of finances, engagement with stakeholders and site investigations - Council is embarking on a new way forward to ensure all projects are able to be responsibly delivered.

On Monday, 27 November 2023, Council held a Special Meeting to make a decision on its Major Projects. Council Members unanimously supported:

- A new build for the Walkerville Bowling & Community Club building;
- New Walkerville Oval lighting, tennis/netball courts and cricket practice nets;
- Going to market to investigate both a 'refurbishment' option and a 'new build' option for the 39 Smith Street Recreation Centre; and
- A renovation for the Walkerville Sports Club building.

The Citizen of the Year Awards are close about to to public nominations. Members of the community are encouraged to put individual forward an organisation that has noteworthy positive and contribution to our community over the past year.

There are four award categories to nominate people for:

- Citizen of the Year: To be eligible, the person must be an Australian citizen.
- Young Citizen of the Year: To be eligible, the person must be at least 16 years of age, but under 30, on 26 January of the Awards year.
- Community Event of the Year: This is presented to the person/group who has staged the most outstanding community event during the past year.
- Active Citizenship Award: This is presented to a person or group delivering outstanding work on an event of project during the past year.

The Awards reward and recognise individuals and organisations that have made a noteworthy contribution during the past year, and/or given outstanding service over a number of years to a local community over and above normal employment duties.

Outstanding contribution and community service includes areas such as education, health, fundraising, charitable and voluntary services, business, sport, arts, the environment or any other area that contributes to the advancement and wellbeing of the community.

Nominations forms can be found on the Council website. Hard copy nomination forms can also be collected from the Civic & Community Centre during business hours.

Nominations will close at midnight on Friday, 8 December 2023.

Kerb cut-outs to support our trees

Kerb and gutter repairs on Redford Street and Wilpena Street, Vale Park, provide an opportunity to give more room to our street trees.

In modern urban landscapes, street trees often compete for room with road infrastructure. It is therefore common for kerb and gutters to be lifted by tree roots.

Council has recognised the importance of supporting the health of our trees, whilst also maintaining our kerbing assets by using kerb cut-outs at the base of our trees.

These cut-outs allow water to move more freely into the root zone of the tree, as well as room for the tree roots to move while minimising the damage to infrastructure.

The Town of Walkerville's urban forest covers approximately 25% of the Council area. Council believes that trees form a crucial part of the Township's identity, as they provide the community with urban greening and a cooler landscape to live in.

Reporting to the Team Leader People, Governance & Risk (TLPGR), the incumbent will be responsible for providing support and advice to the Council on governance matters, including corporate governance principles, risk management and compliance.
