Administration Response – Acting General Manager

The developer is reinstating the footpath with asphalt at this time to make it safe for pedestrians. Once the development has been finalised the developer will be required to reinstate the footpath as per its original condition.

#### QUESTIONS FROM THE GALLERY



6.1 Intersection of Hawkers Road & Dutton Tce Pedestrian Safety - Dr Pooja Newman

What is the Council planning to do to improve pedestrian safety at the roundabout crossing at the intersection of Hawkers Road and Dutton Terrace?

Administration Response – CEO

At this stage, Council has not identified any works for the roundabout; however, Council has identified works along Hawkers Road, which includes pedestrian refuges. An extensive consultation process will be undertaken regarding the proposed works. The General Manager and I met with the Wilderness School Principal who was provided with an outline of the proposed works and the consultation process. The Principal was encouraged to notify parents on the proposed works and provide feedback as part of the consultation process.

Furthermore, reducing the speed to 40km is currently being considered for Walkerville Tce, this does not mean further consideration will not be given to reducing speed limits within the Council area. A review will be undertaken 6 months after implementation of speed reduction on Walkerville Tce. Following this review Council may further consider alternate areas that may require speed reductions within the area.

6.2 DPTI proposed impacts O'Bahn City Access Project – Carolyn Wigg President Walkerville Residents Association

Will the Council seek further advice on any impact the proposed widening at the intersection of Park Terrace and Bundey's Road is likely to have during construction on

- a) Traffic movement, delays and queue lengths and
- b) Road alignments and existing vegetation in the TOW? and

Also whether there will be any consequential delays to motorists travelling into or from the City once the project is completed.

Administration Response - Acting General Manager

A report has been included in tonight's agenda in regard to this matter. Administration have had an initial meeting DPTI and have made it clear that Council is seeking information regarding traffic impacts for Walkerville. The Acting General Manager advised that the question will be taken on notice and further information will be forwarded to the Walkerville Residents Association.

6.3 Development 13 Fife Street Vale Park – Ms S Colgate

When a building is going to be a habitable dwelling, why it is not classified so that privacy and other issues as related to domestic dwellings are complied with? In a dwelling a single storey building must be 3m off the rear fence and a 2 storey 8m off the rear fence. The massive 2 storey granny flat is 1m off the rear fence why has this been allowed?

Administration Response – Chief Executive Officer

Due to the many building and procedural irregularities related to 'the granny flat' related to classification, size, positioning on black, POS to name a few, the time for a judicial review related to this matter is long overdue and necessary. What is the correct procedure for beginning a judicial review for the building under construction at 13 Fife Street Vale Park?

Administration Response - Chief Executive Officer

The matter will be considered on 18 June 2015 by Council's Development Assessment Panel. Representors will be provided with the opportunity to speak to their submissions in relation to the development. Members of the public wishing to discuss judicial review have been advised to liaise with the ERD Court who will provide further and better particulars on the process involved.
