New citizens celebrated at Citizenship Ceremony

Town of Walkerville has welcomed and sworn in 13 new Australian citizens today.

Friends and family supported the new citizens on the day, and a number of official guests attended the event, including Mayor Melissa Jones, Councillor John Zeppel, Aman Kaur and Anthony Vanstone, Town of Walkerville Chief Executive Officer Andrew MacDonald, the Honourable Heidi Girolamo MLC (on behalf of the Honourable Jing Lee MLC), Member for Adelaide Minister Lucy Hood and Member for Torrens Minister Dana Wortley.

The new citizens previously hailed from a number of different countries, including the United Kingdom, India, China, Canada, Sri Lanka, and Vietnam.

Mayor Melissa Jones congratulated the new citizens at the ceremony and said it was a great honour to confer citizenship on them today.





Policies for consultation

Two Council policies are currently out for public consultation the draft Behavioural Management Policy and the draft Casual Vacancies (Supplementary Elections) Policy.

Both these policies went out to public consultation from 9am on Tuesday, 19 September 2023, and will close at 5pm on Monday, 9 October 2023. These policies were endorsed for consultation at the September Ordinary Meeting of Council.

The new draft Behavioural Management Policy, which sets out standards for Council Members behaviour and conduct, was reviewed and updated to meet the recent changes to the Behavioural Management Framework for Council Members, which was implemented on 17 November 2022 by the Local Government Association of South Australia.

This Policy makes it mandatory for all councils to prepare and adopt a Behavioural Management Policy in accordance with Section 262B of the Local Government Act 1999.

This draft Behavioural Management Policy sets out the requirements for Council in regard to the management of behaviour of Council Members and the process for receipt and management of a complaint received regarding the conduct of a Council Member.

The draft Casual **Vacancies** (Supplementary Elections) Policy formerly the Elections - Casual Vacancies Supplementary Elections Policy – was reviewed to ensure the efficient allocation of Council resources in the event of a vacancy occurring.

This draft Policy reflects minor changes to ensure it complies with legislation and internal current policies.

Certain sections of the Policy have been amended or removed due to

outdated Acts, Regulations or terminology that is referenced in the current Policy.

Part 2, 6 of the Local Government (Elections) Act 1999 stipulates that a Council must comply with the requirements of the Act when a vacancy occurs on Council.

Alfred Street - A Greener Gateway project wins sustainability award

Town of Walkerville won the Excellence in Environmental Sustainability Award at the Institute of Public Works Engineering Australasia (IPWEA) South Australia awards this month.

This award is presented to a Local Government project that displays key outcomes in environmental remediation, amenity enhancement and utilisation improvement.

IPWEA judges recognised the Alfred Street project due to its unique design, including its permeable pavers and tree planting gateway, which showcased how green corridors can be created within restricted urban environments.

The project took place over the 2022/23 financial year and resulted in a huge streetscape beautification overhaul of Alfred Street in Walkerville.

This project transformed a once 'run down' laneway into a green plaza that is readily accessible to pedestrians visiting the local shops or playground.

The project took six months to complete and aims to address issues arising from a warming climate and stormwater management.

Meet our newest mascot — the Walkerville Wallaby!


Town of Walkerville and the Walkerville Library's Walkerville Wallaby campaign is in full swing!

Consultation for a Food Organics & Garden Organics trial in Walkerville

Town of Walkerville is investigating the possibility of undertaking a weekly Food Organics & Garden Organics (FOGO) collections trial in the Township.

This trial would be opt-in for residents and would involve a different bin pick-up schedule.

Instead of the normal 'blue bin once a week and green bin once a fortnight', participants would instead have a collection schedule of 'green bin once a week and blue bin once a fortnight'. The yellow bin would continue to be picked up fortnightly.


A weekly FOGO collection could assist greatly with reducing the cost of waste management in the Council area, while also having a benefit on the environment.

In Town of Walkerville's last bin audit by East Waste, 50% of the contents of blue bins

were food and compostable items that should have gone in the green bin and 10% were packaged food in plastic bags or containers that should have been emptied into the green bin beforehand.

If people in the Township improved their rubbish sorting of food and compostable materials, it could save the community \$96,000 per year.

Residents are always passionate about their bin collection schedule, so Council will be going out to consultation to understand if those who live in the Town of Walkerville have an interest in participating in this trial.

At the <u>Ordinary Council Meeting of 19 June 2023</u>, Council moved a motion to better understand the impacts associated with FOGO bins being collected weekly instead of fortnightly.

The results from this survey - once concluded - will inform a business case for Council about the potential of undertaking a FOGO trial in the next financial year, including the potential costs incurred by Council and the benefits and risks that might be involved with introducing 'Sustainable Kerbside Service'.


