Town Hall and concierge works

Town of Walkerville recently completed refurbishment works at the Walkerville Civic & Community Centre in the concierge area and on the Walkerville Town Hall.

Council completed exterior painting and repair works on the Walkerville Town Hall.

The condition of the doors and windows of the Town Hall had started to deteriorate, with cracking and fading paint spoiling the aesthetic of the local heritage-listed building.

The scope of works involved stripping away



the damaged paint, making any necessary repairs to the existing timbers, and applying a new base coat and top coat to all doors and windows.

This work has now been completed and has significantly enhanced the Town Hall's external appearance.

The first stage of the concierge project involved the installation of glass screening and a lockable gate, which were fitted to the existing concierge structure.

The second and final stage involved the installation of a single continuous suspended strip light, which has now replaced the previous pendant lighting.



This project was undertaken to the Civic & Community Centre concierge to improve safety for customer service staff.





Santa's repair workshop

On Friday, 11 August 2023, and Saturday, 12 August 2023, Santa's little helpers were busy undertaking a repair working bee.

Members of the Walkerville Community Committee (WCC) – including Mayor Melissa Jones, Deputy Mayor Liz Trotter, Councillor John Zeppel and Councillor Aman Kaur – and local volunteers were hard at work repairing the many floats that are normally on show during the Walkerville Miniature Christmas Pageant.

All of the floats for the much-loved event – which will be held in November – received a face-lift and were given the green light, ahead of the pageant.

The Walkerville Miniature Christmas Pageant was originally an event run by the late Peter Golding. A selection of his floats were gifted to the Council to keep the Miniature Christmas Pageant running.





Watch out for early snake season!

Early reports from snake catchers are showing that snake season is starting earlier than expected, with this summer expected to be a bumper year for the creatures.

Local residents should be aware that snakes are out and about when traversing the Township, particularly around the River Torrens Linear Park Trail.

Last week, four red-bellied black snakes (three babies and an adult) were found in a section of the River Torrens Linear Park Trail.

If you have spotted a snake in the Town of Walkerville area, notify Council on 8342 7100 as a snake alert can be raised to warn other people in the Township.

Council does not provide a snake removal service, so if a snake is found on private property, please contact a professional snake catcher.







Greater Adelaide Regional Plan: consultation

The Greater Adelaide Regional Plan Discussion Paper has been released for consultation for a 12-week engagement period, beginning on Monday, 14 August 2023, and will conclude on Monday, 6 November 2023.

It is expected that the Greater Adelaide population could grow by up to 670,000 people over the next 30 years.

This discussion paper aims to start a conversation about how our State will change over the next few decades.

This includes how people live, play and work in Greater Adelaide, as well as identify land that can accommodate future housing and employment growth.



Town of Walkerville is working with the Local Government Association and the State Planning Commission to promote the discussion paper and is encouraging people in the community to have their say in the future of Greater Adelaide.



Alfred Street nominated for award shortlist

The Alfred Street – Greener Gateway project has been shortlisted for the Institute of Public Works Engineering Australasia (IPWEA) Excellence Awards category of *Environment & Sustainability*.



The Alfred Street project – which was completed earlier this year – showcases the Town of Walkerville's focus on resilient design and sustainability.

This street was transformed into a one-way pedestrian-friendly road with additional roadside trees and improved stormwater management through permeable pavement.

The project has been shortlisted as part of the IPWEA Excellence Awards and the winner will be announced at an awards ceremony on 8 September 2023.





Completion of 2022/23 footpath program

Town of Walkerville's annual footpath program has now been completed.

Each year, the Town of Walkerville repairs and replaces footpaths across the Township as part of Council's Capital Renewal Program.

The paths completed this year – including Smith Street and Warwick Street in Walkerville, and Stewart Avenue, Cambridge Street, Redford Street and Wilpena Avenue in Vale Park – have freshened up their areas and made them safer for the community.

The footpaths on Council's draft list for renewal this financial year are:

- North East Road, Walkerville Smith Street to Stephen Terrace
- Nottage Terrace, Medindie Northcote Terrace to Main North Road
- Smith Street, Walkerville Church Terrace to Carpark (western side)

The 2023/24 Annual Business Plan includes the funding of \$2,899,000 to go towards existing infrastructure works, like footpath renewals.

Works for these footpaths are expected to begin early 2024.
