Library Survey 2.0 results

The results of the Library Survey 2.0 are in! Following consultation with the community, Walkerville Library opening hours will not change.



Council engaged Walkerville Library users and the community to understand what people wanted in relation to opening hours for the Library.

Approximately 299 people participated in the survey, with a majority of participants (61%) stating that they don't want the current Library opening hours to change. This preference was common among ratepayers, residents and other library users, and across all age groups.

There was an appetite for late-night Library opening hours on a Thursday, which may be something Council investigates in the future.


Traffic and speed surveys

As part of the second stage of the Transport Strategy Survey, Stantec and Austraffic will be conducting traffic and speed surveys in multiple locations around the Township starting on Monday, 28 August 2023.

Streets that will have a traffic and speed survey include: Irwin Terrace and Walkerville Terrace in Gilberton; Smith Street, Fuller Street, Burlington Street, Brunswick Street, Wilsden Street, Church Terrace and Devonshire Street in Walkerville; and Lansdowne Terrace and Harris Street in Vale Park.

The aim of the surveys is to understand the movement and car speeds on these particular roads and investigate how a 40km/h speed limit would work in these areas.

The Great Spring Clean!

All Australians are being encouraged to put the "great" back into the great outdoors by participating in Clean Up Australia's Great Spring Clean.

Pip Kiernan, Chair of Clean Up Australia, said, "Spring cleaning our homes is an annual ritual for so many people – so we're encouraging whole communities to get out and clean up their local environments next month."

Watch out for early snake season!

Early reports from snake catchers are showing that snake season is starting earlier than expected, with this summer expected to be a bumper year for the creatures.

Local residents should be aware that snakes are out and about when traversing the Township, particularly around the River Torrens Linear Park Trail.

A couple weeks ago, four red-bellied black snakes (three babies and an adult) were found in a section of the River Torrens Linear Park Trail.

If you have spotted a snake in the Town of Walkerville area, notify Council on 8342 7100 as a snake alert can be raised to warn other people in the Township.

Council does not provide a snake removal service, so if a snake is found on private property, please contact a professional snake catcher.



Greater Adelaide Regional Plan: Consultation

The Greater Adelaide Regional Plan Discussion Paper has been released for consultation for a 12-week engagement period, beginning on Monday, 14 August 2023, and will conclude on Monday, 6 November 2023.

It is expected that the Greater Adelaide population could grow by up to 670,000 people over the next 30 years.

This discussion paper aims to start a conversation about how our State will change over the next few decades.

This includes how people live, play and work in Greater Adelaide, as well as identify land that can accommodate future housing and employment growth.



Town of Walkerville is working with the Local Government Association and the State Planning Commission to promote the discussion paper and is encouraging people in the community to have their say in the future of Greater Adelaide.

All Town of Walkerville residents have until the end of the month, 31 August 2023, to get their dog and cat registrations renewed.

Not only do your dogs and cats need to be registered, they also need to be desexed and microchipped!


