### Remember to recycle at Christmas! 🛕 📅 🟖 🤎

Most gift packaging, drink and food containers can be recycled, including:

- Christmas wrapping (paper only no cellophane or plastic wrapping please. If you can't rip it, you can't recycle it in the yellow recycle bin.)
- Cards
- Cardboard boxes (crush them down to make more room in the bin)
- Bottles and jars (plastic and glass)
- Cans
- Tins
- Milk, juice and custard cartons
- Foil trays (give then a quick clean first)
- Foil wrappers (scrunched into a fist sized ball)

## Kerb cut-outs to support our trees

Kerb and gutter repairs on Redford Street and Wilpena Street, Vale Park, provide an opportunity to give more room to our street trees.

In modern urban landscapes, street trees often compete for room with road infrastructure. It is therefore common for kerb and gutters to be lifted by tree roots.

Council has recognised the importance of supporting the health of our trees, whilst also maintaining our kerbing assets by using kerb cut-outs at the base of our trees.

These cut-outs allow water to move more freely into the root zone of the tree, as well as room for the tree roots to move while minimising the damage to infrastructure.

The Town of Walkerville's urban forest covers approximately 25% of the Council area. Council believes that trees form a crucial part of the Township's identity, as they provide the community with urban greening and a cooler landscape to live in.



## River Torrens Linear Park: works update


Stage 3 of the River Torrens Linear Park shared use path enhancement is underway to provide a safer and more enjoyable experience for recreational users.

The path upgrade is being undertaken by the of Norwood. City Payneham & St Peters and works are expected be completed February 2024.

Please note that the shared path from Battams Road to Holton Court will be closed from November 2023 to February 2024.

### Council's major yearly review document has been released.


Under the Local Government Act 1999. Councils are required to report on their undertakings during the previous financial year, including publishing full financial statements.

#### The Position:

## Footpath renewal and kerb repair

The Town of Walkerville is undertaking its annual footpath renewal program and various kerb and gutter repair work.

The paths in this year's 2023/24 Footpath Renewal Program are:

- Nottage Terrace, Medindie Northcote Terrace to Main North Road (in progress).
- Smith Street, Walkerville Church Terrace to Walkerville Oval car park entrance (completed).
- North East Road, Walkerville (various patch repair) Smith Street to Stephen Terrace.

The footpaths will be constructed in asphalt to match in with the existing material.

The kerb and gutter repairs have been scheduled for the following roads:

- Victoria Terrace, Walkerville;
- Church Terrace, Walkerville;
- Ponder Avenue. Gilberton:
- Redford Street, Vale Park (in progress);
- Wilpena Avenue, Vale Park (in progress);
- Tonkin Street, Vale Park; and
- Tennyson Street, Medindie.

Works will occur in the lead up to Christmas. The contractors will letter drop residents to forewarn of upcoming works.

During this time, it would be appreciated if residents do not park their cars on the road.


