

## Town of Walkerville thanked for Foodbank donations

With the assistance from the Town of Walkerville community, Council was able to donate 85.98kg of food to the Foodbank SA/NT Food Drive in December.

This equates to around 171.96 meals for Aussies in need around the Christmas holidays!

## Road resealing in the Township

Next week, roads throughout the Township will be resealed, which will impact residents on certain streets.

The roads that are set to be resealed are:

- Wilpena Avenue, Vale Park 8-9 January 2024
- Redford Street, Vale Park 9-10 January 2024
- Tonkin Street, Vale Park 10 January 2024
- Vale Street, Vale Park 10-11 January 2024



- Church Terrace roundabouts, Walkerville (at St Andrews Street crossover and Burlington Street crossover) – 10-11 January 2024
- Ponder Avenue, Gilberton 11-12 January 2024

Residents on these streets are asked to:

- Ensure their vehicles are not parked on the road on the above dates;
- Ensure their household members, particularly children and animals, are kept well clear of the work zone until the works have been completed;
- Not allow water to run into gutters during the above period;
- Remain alert of operations being carried out, as it involves large moving machinery and hot bitumen products;
- Exercise care and caution when traversing the road works during this period, as there may be loose materials/stone or hot bitumen on the road;
- On the day of street works, all requests and assistance need to be directed to contractors, Downer or Altus Traffic Control personnel on site if required; and
- If the above dates coincide with waste collection, please ensure all rubbish bins are placed out prior to 6am as early waste collection may have been arranged.



#### Let's reminisce: A ball at the hall

Little is recorded about the below image from 1901 of a celebration at the Walkerville Town Hall, decorated with flowers, greenery and large flags - some appearing to be the St Andrew's Church flag.



Standing centre front is Archdeacon George Dove, rector of St Andrew's Church, Canon of St Peter's Cathedral and a long-term resident of Walkerville.

Although St Andrew's Church organised an annual ball, a search of old newspapers has found a possible explanation for this photograph - 'a social welcome by the congregation of St Andrew's Church was tendered to Archdeacon Dove in the Walkerville Hall. There was a large attendance.' Apparently, Archdeacon Dove and Mrs Dove had returned from a trip to England. (The Register 19 June 1901)

This throwback is part of the Town of Walkerville's monthly history series, touching on iconic and famous moments, people and places in Walkerville history. The history of this ball was researched and collected with assistance from local historian, Lyn O'Grady.

## Weekly waste tips

### Bones, meat and seafood are ending up in the landfill bin. All food scraps should be going in the green bin!

Unless you have a home composting system set up, your food scraps, including citrus, onion, dairy, meat, bones, fish, fruit and vegetables, should be disposed of properly in the green bin.

Before putting any food scraps into the green bin, be sure to remove all packaging first – unless it is compostable. This includes plastic packets, bags and containers, and glass jars.


All food scraps in a green bin are taken to a commercial composting facility to be processed and made into valuable compost, soil and mulch products, which are then used on South Australian farms and vineyards and in household gardens as well.

Currently in SA, around 40% of waste placed in landfill bins is food and other compostable items, like paper towel and tissues.

When organic waste is sent to landfill, it rots and releases methane – a harmful greenhouse gas with 21 times the global warming potential of carbon.

You can do your bit for the environment by placing food and other organic waste in the green bin.

#### **Walkervillage Christmas Fair**

#### **Council wins SA IPWEA Sustainability Award for Alfred Street**



Town of Walkerville won the Excellence in Environmental Sustainability Award the of Public Institute Works Engineering Australasia (IPWEA) South Australia Awards on 8 September 2023 for its Alfred Street project.

IPWEA judges recognised the Alfred Street project due to its unique design, which showcased how green corridors can created within restricted urban environments.

#### Inaugural "Walkerville comes alive" SALA event

Council held its first Walkerville comes alive event for last year's South Australian Living Artists (SALA) Festival.

The event was a huge success, with many residents praising the event.

There were six lucky winners who won the very art that was created live on the day.



#### **New Sustainability Committee established for Walkerville**



Council established a new Sustainability Committee to look at the current social and environmental challenges facing the Town of Walkerville area, as well as to consider how to address these issues into the future.

The new Committee includes Mayor Melissa Jones (Ex-Officio), Deputy Mayor John Zeppel, Councillor James Williams and Councillor Aman Kaur.

#### Netflix's *Desert King* filming in Walkerville

The Township was abuzz November when filming began in Walkerville for the new Netflix TV series, Desert King.

This new six-episode neo-western TV series is set to air in 2024.



#### Hamilton Reserve's nature play area wins State award



The landscaper of Hamilton Reserve, LCS Landscapes, won an award at the Master Landscapers of SA Excellence Awards for Commercial Landscape Construction \$500,000 - \$1,000,000 for the rejuvenation project of Hamilton Reserve.

The Reserve was finalised and open to the public in January 2022 and has been a popular park for residents and visitors.

#### Walkerville Library launched Wattle the Walkerville Wallaby

In a bid to encourage more children to sign up to the Walkerville Library and engage in the wonders of reading, the Library created a new mascot, Wattle the Walkerville Wallaby.

The Walkerville Wallaby campaign saw over 100 children sign up to the library in September/October 2023. The first 100 children that signed up also received a free Walkerville Wallaby gift pack.

At the end of the campaign, the library held a launch event for the wallaby mascot with children able to meet a range of Australian animals. The Library also gave away a tablet with access to all the library apps for reading, audiobooks and e-magazines.

#### **Township-wide Community Survey consultation undertaken**



A six-week Community Survey consultation was undertaken in 2023.

The last Community Survey occurred a number of years ago, as a result of disruptions from COVID-19.

Council received positive results from the public in the survey, which found that Town of Walkerville was outperforming other councils in overall community satisfaction, along with a range of other areas, such as customer services, parks and consultation.

## Notice of public meeting to reactivate the Walkerville Residents' Association

A meeting will be held early this year with the aim to reactivate the Walkerville Residents' Association (WRA), which has been inactive for the past four years.

The meeting, open to all residents of the Town of Walkerville, will be held from 6pm-7pm on Monday, 5 February 2024, at the Walkerville Civic & Community Centre in Room 1855 (entrance will be available via the rear car park, off Stephen Terrace).

Residents will be aware that a proposed new development on the site of the Buckingham Arms Hotel is currently under consideration by the State Commission Assessment Panel (SCAP). This proposed new development consists of three 10-storey towers with some 180 residences. Several residents in the Walkerville Council area have significant concerns about this development.

A revived Walkerville Resident's Association, open to all residents of the Walkerville, Vale Park, Gilberton and Medindie areas, aims to discuss the proposed design and size of the development, including traffic and environmental aspects at the entry to Walkerville Terrace.
