Conditions to Keep Excess Dogs

The Town of Walkerville By-Law No. 5; permits the number of dogs on a small property to one (1); and for all other properties the permitted number of dogs is two.

Any approval granted will be subject to the following conditions:

- All applications will be subject to an internal approval process.
- An application fee is applicable upon lodgement of an application to keep more than the prescribed number of dogs.
- The property where the dogs are housed may be subject to inspections by Council's Authorised Officers.
- The property at which the dogs are kept is to be maintained in a sanitary condition at all times.
- The dogs must not become a nuisance to other residents or the general public.
- All dogs must be registered prior to a permit being issued.
- Housing, fencing and exercise areas at the premises are appropriate for the size and breed of the dogs.
- The dogs are kept as domestic pets for family enjoyment only.
- Where the number of dogs by natural attrition or otherwise is reduced to two or less the number is not to be increased.
- If the permit is approved the dogs kept under the permit cannot be used for commercial purposes.
- When the number of dogs by natural attrition or otherwise is reduced to two or less the number is not to be increased again.
- Where a complaint is received against a dog(s) kept at the property and an investigation by Council's Authorised Officer finds the complaint to be justified, the person responsible for the dog will reduce the number of dogs on the property allowed under the By-Law.

By Law No. 5 - Section 7

7. Limit on Dog Numbers

7.1 The limit on the number of dogs kept:

7.1.1 in a small property shall be one dog; *

7.1.2 in premises other than a small property, the limit shall be two dogs.*

7.2 A person must not, without permission, keep any dog on any premises where the number of dogs on the premises exceeds the limit unless:

7.2.1 the premises is an approved kennel establishment; or

7.2.2 the Council has exempted the premises from compliance with this sub paragraph.

Definition

***3.10 Small property means a property involving any self-contained dwelling where the property or part thereof (i.e. flat, home unit etc.) contains a secured unobstructed yard area of less than 100 square metres.**
