Alfred Street - A Greener Gateway project wins sustainability award

Town of Walkerville won the Excellence in Environmental Sustainability Award at the Institute of Public Works Engineering Australasia (IPWEA) South Australia awards last week.

This award is presented to a Local Government project that displays key outcomes in environmental remediation, amenity enhancement and utilisation improvement.

IPWEA judges recognised the Alfred Street project due to its unique design, including its permeable pavers and tree planting gateway, which showcased how green corridors can be created within restricted urban environments.

The project took place over the 2022/23 financial year and resulted in a huge streetscape beautification overhaul of Alfred Street in Walkerville.

This project transformed a once 'run down' laneway into a green plaza that is readily accessible to pedestrians visiting the local shops or playground.

The project took six months to complete and aims to address issues arising from a warming climate and stormwater management.

Council completed coring and top dressing works at the Walkerville Oval this week.



Works were undertaken to prepare Walkerville Oval for the summer season with verti-draining and top dressing occurring to improve drainage and structure to the turf as it comes out of a busy winter period.

The oval was temporarily unavailable this week, however, works were completed by Friday and is ready for use by the community.

Council staff will monitor and increase watering of the oval over the coming weeks to ensure the oval is ready for cricket season and school sports days.

No golf! - New signs installed at local ovals

Following a number of complaints from local residents, Town of Walkerville has installed signs at Walkerville Oval and Levi Oval reminding the community that golf is not allowed to be played on Council property.

Some community members have been concerned about the number of people who have been playing golf on public property, including the danger it presents to people, pets, cars and houses.

Under Council's By-law No.2 (Local Government Land), golf is not allowed to be played on Council property without permission. As seen here:

Part 3 – Use of Local Government Land

Activities requiring permission 9.

> A person must not without permission of the Council do any of the following on Local Government land:

9.22 Golf

Play or practice golf.

To read the full By-law No.2, head to the Council website.

Any person who is caught playing golf on Council property without permission may be

fined.









Join the Great Aussie Bird Count in Town of Walkerville

Spring is in the air and it's time to celebrate the beauty and diversity of nature and the Township's native bird life.

As part of Council's commitment to preserving the local environment and the incredible wildlife that call it home, Town of Walkerville is excited to announce its participation in the 10th annual Aussie Bird Count, which takes place from 16-22 October 2023.

The Aussie Bird Count is one of Australia's greatest citizen science initiatives that encourages people of all ages to step outside to their favorite spot and spend just 20 minutes observing and counting the birds.

This year, Town of Walkerville and its residents will play an integral role in contributing to bird conservation efforts.



To be involved in the movement during Aussie Bird Count Week, all you need to do is:

- 1. Spend 20 minutes at your favourite outdoor space, like along the River Torrens or at Hamilton Reserve, and note all the birds you see during this period;
- 2. Count the birds and submit the results through the Bird Count app or web form;
- 3. Use the bird finder tool to identify birds you are unsure of; and
- 4. Submit your counts as many times as you want!

Every person who gets involved in the initiative can help BirdLife Australian develop an understanding of local birds in the Council area.


So put 20 minutes aside in the middle of October and keep an eye out for the local birds!

Meet our newest mascot — the Walkerville Wallaby!


Town of Walkerville and the Walkerville Library's Walkerville Wallaby campaign is in full swing!

Consultation for a Food Organics & Garden Organics trial in Walkerville

Town of Walkerville is investigating the possibility of undertaking a weekly Food Organics & Garden Organics (FOGO) collections trial in the Township.

This trial would be opt-in for residents and would involve a different bin pick-up schedule.

Instead of the normal 'blue bin once a week and green bin once a fortnight', participants would instead have a collection schedule of 'green bin once a week and blue bin once a fortnight'. The yellow bin would continue to be picked up fortnightly.


A weekly FOGO collection could assist greatly with reducing the cost of waste management in the Council area, while also having a benefit on the environment.

In Town of Walkerville's last bin audit by East Waste, 50% of the contents of blue bins

were food and compostable items that should have gone in the green bin and 10% were packaged food in plastic bags or containers that should have been emptied into the green bin beforehand.

If people in the Township improved their rubbish sorting of food and compostable materials, it could save the community \$96,000 per year.

Residents are always passionate about their bin collection schedule, so Council will be going out to consultation to understand if those who live in the Town of Walkerville have an interest in participating in this trial.

At the <u>Ordinary Council Meeting of 19 June 2023</u>, Council moved a motion to better understand the impacts associated with FOGO bins being collected weekly instead of fortnightly.

The results from this survey - once concluded - will inform a business case for Council about the potential of undertaking a FOGO trial in the next financial year, including the potential costs incurred by Council and the benefits and risks that might be involved with introducing 'Sustainable Kerbside Service'.

The consultation on whether to undertake a FOGO trial will run until 5pm on Friday, 29 September 2023. For more information, head to the <u>Your Say</u> Walkerville website.
