Walkerville Oval redevelopment gets green light

The Town of Walkerville is pleased to announce the progression of a long awaited Walkerville Oval precinct upgrade.



Message from the Mayor

I am very pleased to inform you that Council has resolved to proceed with one of its largest community projects to date – the redevelopment of Walkerville Oval.

I am delighted to see us move forward with our plans to upgrade the precinct to provide a sporting and community hub that services the needs of both current and future generations. I wish to assure you that we have carefully considered all aspects of the project, while exercising extensive scrutiny into our financial position.

During our recent consultation, while 74% of respondents were in favour of the redevelopment, the size and cost of the proposal were key concerns. Council understands how important it is to take community feedback into consideration and as a result, we have revised the designs and reduced spend on the overall build while retaining the bespoke character of the original concept.

At its [Special Meeting of 30 November 2020](#), Council approved a scaled back proposal with a more modest built form. This includes two buildings fit-for-purpose (linked by an external arbour) to accommodate user groups, commercial activity and to increase the community's access to, engagement with and use of the site, while also maximising the retention of available open space.

The main changes to the previous plans include:

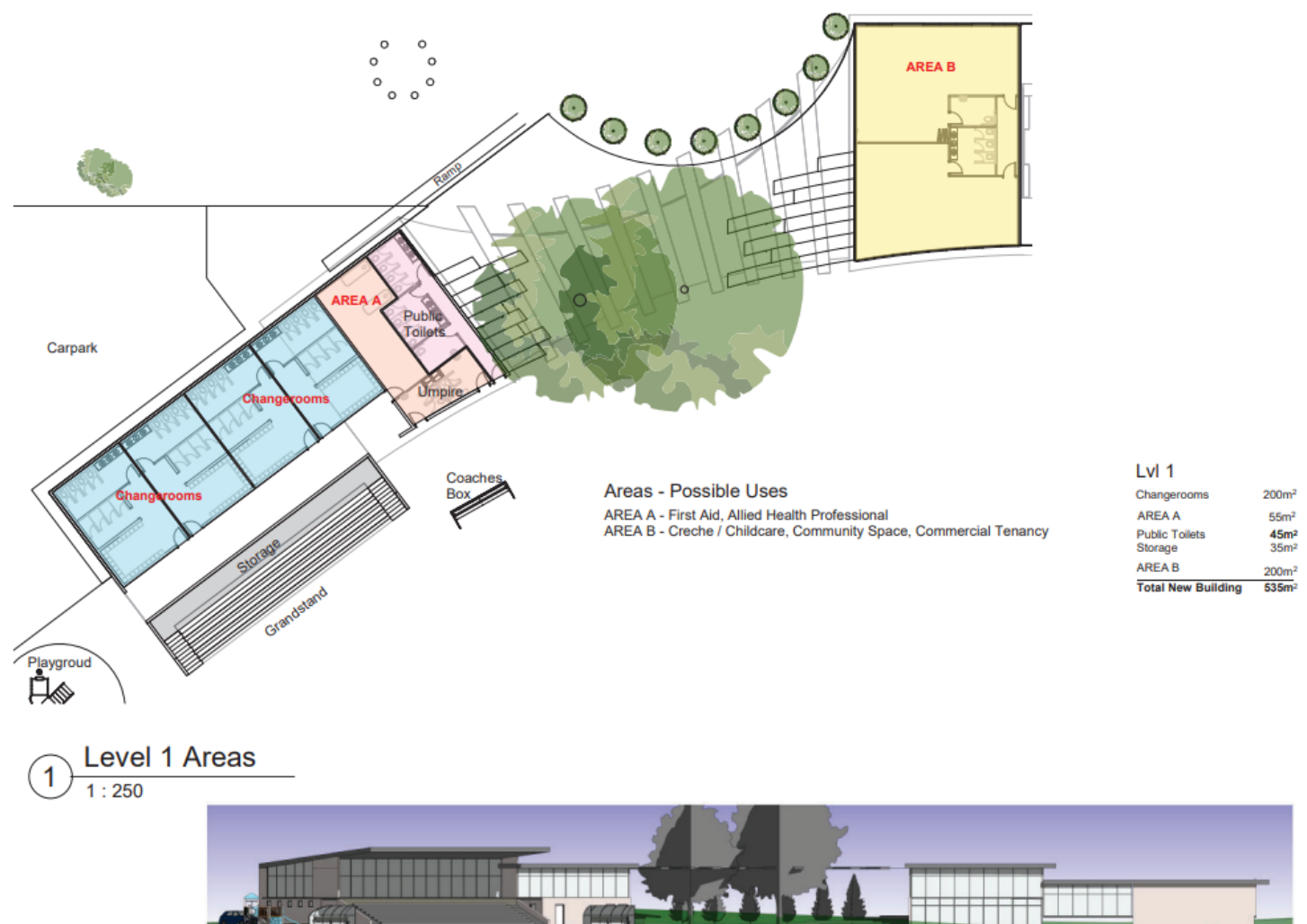
- the removal of the central function areas (not deemed a priority by the community);
- the inclusion of additional areas accessible by the community for hire; and
- the possible inclusion of crèche / childcare facility.

It is clear over the past two decades that the community has expressed support for some type of redevelopment of the Walkerville Oval precinct. The infrastructure is not getting any younger, but our community demographic is. This option delivers value for money, an integrated sporting hub on par with neighbouring Councils in the eastern metro region (i.e. ARC at Campbelltown, Glenunga Hub, Glenside) and a facility that is going to meet the long-term needs of future generations.

Council will contribute \$4 million towards the project and will be applying for a matching contribution of \$4 million from the State Government as part of the Local Government Infrastructure Partnership Program. In order to be eligible for this funding, Council must have a “shovel-ready” plan and submit its grant application in January.

I look forward to updating you on this project as we progress into the New Year.

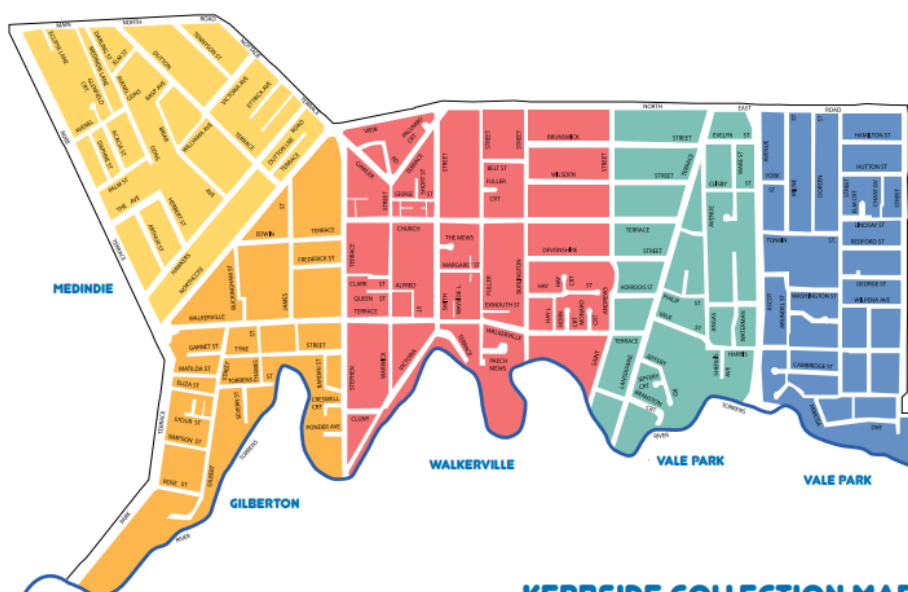

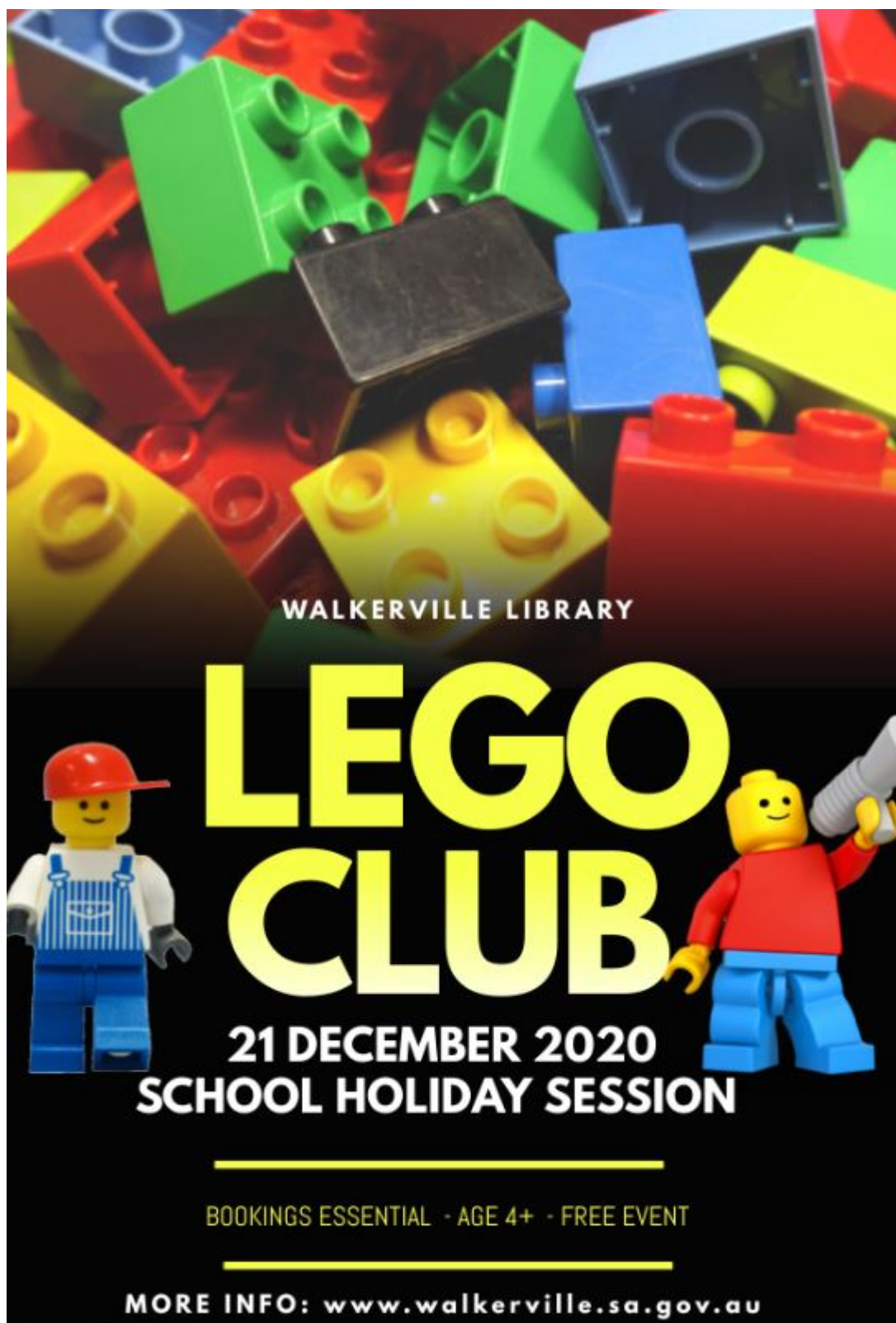

As part of the State Budget 2020/21, additional small business support has been funded as a result of COVID-19.

The Small Business Grant program provides support to South Australian small businesses that have been highly impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

The program will provide a second round of \$10,000 grants to small businesses and not-for-profits which remain adversely impacted by coronavirus. The program also introduces \$3,000 grants for owner operated small businesses conducted from a commercial premises that do not employ staff.

Face masks

➡ How to put a mask on:

- 1 Wash and dry (or sanitise) your hands.
- 2 Take your clean, unused mask by the ear loops or strings.
- 3 Put them over your ears or tie them behind your head.
- 4 Make sure your mask is completely covering your nose, mouth and chin.

⚠ Don't touch or adjust the front of your mask while wearing it – it's the part that's protecting you from COVID-19. If you do touch it by accident, wash or sanitise your hands right away.

⬅ How to take a mask off:

- 1 Wash and dry (or sanitise) your hands.
- 2 Do not touch the front of your mask while removing it. Use only the ear loops or strings.
- 3 Store cloth face masks in a plastic bag until you have an opportunity to wash them. When disposing single-use surgical face masks, place in a bag or lined bin. Do not put masks into the recycling bin.
- 4 Wash and dry (or sanitise) your hands.

- plaques

Grants are not available for organisational operating costs, eg newsletters or for purchase, replacement or new materials that are already covered in the assets and infrastructure program; eg park benches.

Council has an annual budget for Community Fund grants which is awarded on merit.

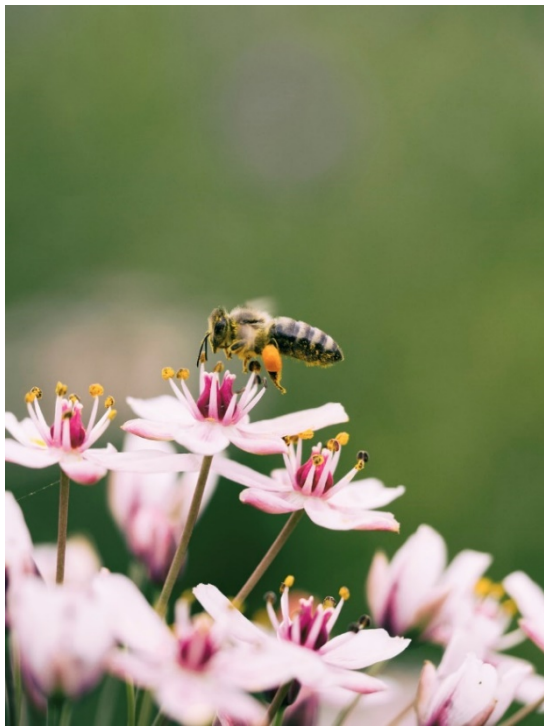
Snake warning

Walkers, joggers, families and pet owners – keep your eyes peeled for snakes along Linear Park Trail.

There have been several snake sightings within Linear Park over the past week. Please be cautious in this area as Council has received reports of a red-bellied black snake on the trail and also a brown snake coming out of long vegetation. Watch out for children and it is recommended dogs remain on leash. Council will be installing warning signage to remind the community to be careful in this area.



Be aware of bees



As we approach the warmer weather, there will be an increase in bees in the area.

If you see a beehive, please be careful. Bees will generally not cause a nuisance unless provoked. Do not go near the bees or the hive and do not spray them with water. Moisture is one of the things bees are searching for, so spraying may actually encourage them to stay.

Please call our Customer Experience Team on 8342 7100 if you believe the activity of a beehive is causing a severe nuisance and/or is a public health and safety risk.

Officers will arrange for an inspection by an apiarist and its subsequent relocation will be considered. If the hive cannot be successfully removed and relocated, Council may be required to eradicate the hive.

Please be advised that bees that have formed a hive more than two metres high in a tree/stobie pole etc, will not be removed as this generally does not pose a health or safety risk.

Is your garden ready for summer?

You don't have to live in the country to be at risk of fire

Council is asking property owners to prepare their properties **prior** to the fire danger season.

The fire danger season generally runs from November through to April, although these dates may change due to seasonal conditions.

Council will shortly be sending out letters to property owners to take action. Under the *Fire and Emergency Services Act 2005*, it is the owner's responsibility to take reasonable steps to prevent or inhibit the outbreak or spread of fire. In the event that action is not taken, Council may issue notices to properties affected.

Vacant blocks may present a higher risk of fire outbreak and spread. All property owners are encouraged to:

- Keep grass cut to less than 10cm;
- Cut back overhanging branches and clear undergrowth;
- Get rid of dry grass, leaves, twigs and loose bark;
- Continue to maintain the property throughout the fire danger season.

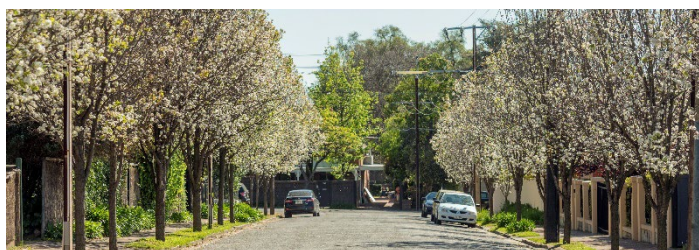
Capital Works Update

The following works will commence next week.

School Emu Crossing in Warwick Street will commence next week and this part of works will be completed by Christmas. In the New Year, a footpath using permeable pavers will be constructed outside of the new picket fence along Warwick Street, from the tennis courts to Church Terrace. Asphalt work on Warwick Street and Clarke Street will occur the second week of the New Year, with all works finished by commencement of the new school year.

River Torrens Linear Path widening will continue next week and be complete by Christmas. The work area will be from the new culvert at the bottom of Jeffery Street through to the base of the steps from the Caravan Park. RTLP users will be diverted across the river at the Willow Bend bridge and back across near the bottom of Lansdowne Terrace. Residents at the access points have been notified, along with the caravan park operator.

Our street sweeping programs are seasonally adjusted to effectively manage the level of risk in streets where issues are present generally relating to street tree litter.

While we make every effort to keep our streets clean year-round, you can help out by doing the following:

SA Power Network Tree Pruning

SA Power Networks vegetation clearance program within the Town of Walkerville will be undertaken between November 2020 and January 2021

SA Power Networks vegetation clearance program consists of the following programs to manage vegetation near powerlines:

- Annual cyclic program in high bushfire risk areas and risk-based approach in medium bushfire risk areas (approximately 430,000 line spans across the state).
- Pre-fire danger season program in high bushfire risk areas – repatrol all spans that were inspected as part of the annual cyclic program prior to 1 May in that year.
- Three-year cyclic program in non-bushfire risk areas.
- Metropolitan Council program – three-year cyclic program.
- Metropolitan 33kV/66kV Pre- Fire Danger Season Program – preventative maintenance program on high voltage feeders.

They have advised Council of their intention to commence these works throughout the township.

Draft Liquor Licence Management Policy

Council has extensively reviewed its Liquor Licence Management Policy and is seeking community feedback on the revised draft document.

In August 2013, Council adopted its first Liquor Licence Management Policy. In October 2015, Council endorsed a revised version of the policy following a number of legislative amendments.

In late 2015, the State Government appointed Hon T. R Anderson to conduct an independent review of the existing *Liquor Licensing Act 1997* and the associated governance frameworks for the management of liquor licencing within the State. Upon completion of the review, Hon T. R Anderson proposed 129 recommendations for extensive and far reaching changes to the legislation; including recommendations that significantly reduced Council's ability and powers to regulate and impose conditions on licensed premises.

In 2016, the State Government adopted the vast majority of the recommendations and proceeded to rollout the amendments over a number of stages between 4 September 2018 and 18 November 2019.

On the basis that Council's existing policy is now outdated and inconsistent with the recently revised provisions of the *Liquor Licensing Act 1997*, a new draft policy – which reflects the new scope of Council's authority as it relates to Liquor Licensing – was presented to Council on 16 November 2020.

The draft policy will be open for consultation from 9am on Friday 27 November 2020 to 5pm Friday 18 December 2020.

South Australians have a further opportunity to provide feedback on the revised draft Planning and Design Code (Code) from 4 November 2020 to **18 December 2020**.

This opportunity follows an initial five-month period of public consultation on the draft Code (October 2019 to February 2020), which resulted in over 2000 submissions. In response, significant improvements have been made to the Code, including the addition of new overlays and zones to better reflect local conditions and address areas of community interest.

The revised draft Code is now available electronically and includes details of the State Planning Commission's proposed policy improvements in response to community feedback. Everyone now has the opportunity to familiarise themselves with the new system, comment on the revised planning policies and experience how the new planning system will operate, once fully implemented.
