#### Minor landscaping works at Belt Reserve

The Town of Walkerville will soon be undertaking minor landscaping works in Belt Reserve, located on the corner of Church Terrace and Fuller Street in Walkerville.

Works will include the installation of a small shelter, new bench seat, brick feature pillars, exposed aggregate concrete pad, new paving and plantings.



The highlight of the works will be the feature paving, which will include banding across the existing footpath as well as a paved 'cross' and plaque in recognition of the St. Andrew's Church's 175<sup>th</sup> Anglican anniversary this year. Works are expected to be completed by the end of the year.



#### Mulch works at local playgrounds

Over the next four to six weeks, all local playgrounds will be receiving new mulch.



Residents can expect some playgrounds to be unavailable during the installation of the new mulch for a short period of time.

Hamilton Reserve recently had new soft fall mulch blown in and the works are now completed.

Alfred Street Playground and Levi Oval Playground will be next to receive new soft fall mulch.

It is expected that these public spaces will be temporarily closed for a morning to undertake the work.

'Christmas in Walkerville'.


#### The winners are:

#### Let's reminisce: Walkerville horse tram no.18 restoration

When horse trams were replaced by electrics in the 1910s, William Neate purchased horse tram no.18 as a playroom for his children, relocating it to the backyard of his home on Walkerville Terrace. Walkerville.

After the death of her parents. Miss E.L. Neate stayed in the family home and converted the horse tram into a fern house. The tram was used as a playhouse and fern house for nearly 50 years.

Subsequently, the Neate family home was acquired planned new for the multi-storey Highways Department building (which was eventually developed into today's The Watson).

Instead of bulldozing the old tramcar, the foreman arranged for it to be taken to his Torrensville depot where, with no particular authority, the staff there, supervised by Mr Don McLaren, rebuilt it.

tram no.18 was restored at the Torrensville depot.

The State Government, finding itself in the possession of a horse tram, made it available to the National Trust of SA in the 1960s for display with their horse-drawn vehicles collection in the former Maylands horse tram depot. After this closed, it came to the Tramway Museum at St Kilda.

As part of the celebrations for the 100th anniversary of the commencement of the horse tram system, on 11 June 1978, the tram was used to convey Premier Don Dunstan into Victoria Square.

The following year, the tram ran at Glenelg to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the opening of the Glenelg electric tramway.

In 1989, the tram featured on an Australia Post stamp issue. The bright yellow horse tram no.18 still remains on display at the St Kilda museum.

This throwback is part of the Town of Walkerville's monthly history series, touching on iconic and famous moments, people and places in Walkerville history. The history of the horse tram no.18 was researched and collected with assistance from local historian, Lyn O'Grady.



Horse tram 18 was used again in the 70s and 80s.

#### **Active Club Program funding**

Local sports clubs or community organisations have the opportunity to apply for a grant up to \$3,000 to assist in the further development of programs and services for their community.

The Active Club Program (ACP) is open for its 52<sup>nd</sup> round with up to \$1,289,000 available in the budget to fund small programs and services for sports and community groups.

Applicants must be a not-for-profit recreation or sports club or community organisation whose purpose is the delivery of active recreation or sports programs and services in South Australia, have a minimum total



membership base of 20 members and be operating for at least 12 months or longer.

The maximum grant available for a small club – less than 100 members – is \$1,500 and applicants with 100 or more members can receive a maximum grant of \$3,000.

This program supports the Office of Recreation, Sport and Racing's (ORSR) 2021-25 Strategic Plan, which has the ambitious task of getting more South Australians moving.



### **Asset Management Plans out for consultation**

The first set of new Asset Management Plans have been released for community consultation, reviewing three major Council asset classes: roads, footpaths and stormwater.

In accordance with the Local Government Act 1999, Council is required to review its Asset Management Plans a minimum of every four years to ensure the Township's valuable services – including roads, footpaths, kerbs, carparks, buildings, stormwater, open spaces, plants and equipment – are properly maintained to a high standard. This allows Council to deliver the required level of service to the community in the most cost-effective manner.



To ensure there is appropriate oversight of these assets, Council reviews sections of the Asset Management Plans to ensure these important assets are well-maintained and meeting community expectations.

This year's draft Asset Management Plans for review cover the roads, footpaths and stormwater systems of the Town of Walkerville.

The draft Asset Management Plans are open for consultation from 9am on Wednesday, 18 October 2023, to 5pm on Friday, 10 November 2023.


#### Programs & Events Officer


