### Major update to 39 Smith Street

In an exciting announcement, the Town of Walkerville is thrilled to reveal that a groundbreaking redevelopment will be taking place in Walkerville - set to reinvigorate the recreational landscape of the community.

In partnership with Member for Adelaide Lucy Hood MP, Council will be providing a brand new, state-of-the-art. recreational facility at 39 Smith Street.

The revitalised centre promises to be a hub of activity, offering community connection, wellness and enriching recreational experiences.

At Monday's Special Council Councillors Meeting, both considered refurbishment of the current building and a knock-downrebuild option. **Members** unanimously supported

complete redevelopment of the site as it would provide a modern and functional centre that caters to the needs of the growing community.

Mayor Melissa Jones said Council had recently been out to market requesting proposals for both a refurbishment option and a new build option to gauge current market costings.

"With estimated new build costs within Council's budget, a brand-new build will provide fitfor-purpose facilities today and into the future. A new centre will ensure better value for money and provide the modern facility that the community has been asking for," said Mayor Jones.

### **ANZAC Day Dawn Service**

### On Thursday, Walkerville RSL held an ANZAC Day Dawn Service at Walkerville Memorial Gardens.

Mayor Melissa Jones made a speech during the service touching on two local soldiers from the area who lost their lives in Gallipoli on 25 April 1915.

Charles Lawrence Hunt was 20 years old when he volunteered for service and was sent in the 1<sup>st</sup> Contingent for Gallipoli. His first day at war – 25 April – was also his last, as he was killed in action at Gallipoli.

Another local soldier, Walter Jordan Rusk of Walkerville, was another young soul killed in action at Gallipoli.

Mayor Jones said during her address, "These two men make up 54 of the fallen from World War I from the Town of Walkerville. Every single one left behind families, friends, classmates, colleagues and neighbours.

"It is hard to imagine the brutality of war, but when you read stories like these – it hits home." It was a touching service hosted by the Walkerville RSL.

### The first consultation for TOWards2035 ends

On Wednesday, the TOWards2035 consultation on the vision for our 10year strategic plan came to a close.

The community engagement in this consultation was phenomenal, and Council Members and Staff want to thank everyone for putting their thoughts forward on what they think should be considered when creating our 'vision' for the strategic plan.

This consultation ran from 9am on Thursday, 4 April 2024, to 5pm on Wednesday, 24 April 2024.

There was one community safety forum and two community pop-up stalls – one at the Walkerville Terrace Shopping Centre and the other at Walkerville Oval during game day. Residents had the opportunity to meet Councillors and discuss ideas for improving the area.

The consultation for TOWards2035 has been a fantastic way to engage with community members on a face-toface level.

In mid-May, a second consultation will take place, focusing on objectives and actions that the community want to see within the strategic plan.

The organisation works alongside child protection, child welfare, family violence and homelessness agencies to provide as many displaced children as possible with an age-appropriate backpack containing a range of essentials and other goodies.

The charity provides four unique tailored programs under the Backpacks 4 SA Kids banner, including:

<u>Backpacks</u>: For kids who leave home with little to no notice and often have no clothing or other essentials.

<u>Home Starter Packs</u>: Designed for families who have left a violent relationship at home and need to start again.

Anchor Packs: For young people aged 12-24 who are experiencing homelessness.


<u>Christmas Program</u>: Provided to newborns to 18-year-olds with Christmas gifts when entering emergency care.




