High Spirits Harmony take out gold!

A recent recipient of Council's Community Fund Grant Program has received the title of "champions" at an international competition.



High Spirits Harmony is an Adelaide choir made up of several residents from the Town of Walkerville area.

The 26-member group won the gold medal in the Barbershop Harmony Australia (BHA) women's chorus competition at the Pan Pacific International Convention last month.

The convention attracted 30 choruses and 55 quartets from around Australia and New Zealand, and from as far away as Japan and Hawaii.

As well as winning the BHA women's chorus competition, High Spirits Harmony placed fourth in the Pan Pacific women's chorus competition.

The group applied for funding as part of Council's <u>Community Fund Program</u>, which assisted with travel costs associated with the trip.

High Spirits Harmony was formed in February 2014, and sings in a cappella harmony exploring a range of musical styles, with an emphasis on enjoying music while aiming for excellence in performance.

The 2023 Pan Pacific Convention was HSH's first international competition.

Transport Strategy

Council hosted a stakeholder session on local road and traffic as part of Stage 2 of the Transport Strategy.



From Bike Adelaide, Walking SA, the RAA and Department for Infrastructure and Transport (DIT), to delegates from all of our local schools – representatives from a range of different areas attended a Transport Strategy session in the Town Hall on Tuesday, 24 October 2023.

The workshop was to gather ideas to identify ways to support safer transport at local schools and improve traffic across the Township. Attendees discussed a range of topics, including:

- What are the current traffic and transport concerns in the area?
- How will students travel to the local schools in Walkerville in 10 years?
- What initiatives should be in the Walkerville Transport Strategy Action Plan to support school travel?
- How will local streets support improved safety, movement and amenity in Walkerville in 10 years?
- What initiatives should be in the Walkerville Transport Strategy Action Plan to support these objectives?

The ideas and solutions discussed will help inform a Council Transport Strategy Action Plan. Community consultation is expected to occur on the Action Plan in February 2024.



2024 Citizen of the Year Awards

The Citizen of the Year Awards are now open and members of the community are encouraged to nominate an individual or organisation that have made a noteworthy and positive contribution to our community over the last year.



2022 Citizen of the Year Liz Horrocks, of Rotary Club of Walkerville.

There are four awards categories to nominate people for:

- Citizen of the Year: To be eligible, the person must be an Australian citizen.
- Young Citizen of the Year: To be eligible, the person must be at least 16 years of age, but under 30, on 26 January of the Awards year.
- Community Event of the Year: This is presented to the person/group who has staged the most outstanding community event during the past year.
- Active Citizenship Award: This is presented to a person or group delivering outstanding work on an event of project during the past year.

The Awards reward and recognise individuals and organisations that have made a noteworthy contribution during the past year, and/or given outstanding service over a number of years to a local community over and above normal employment duties.

Outstanding contribution and community service includes areas such as education, health, fundraising, charitable and voluntary services, business, sport, arts, the environment or any other area that contributes to the advancement and wellbeing of the community.

Hard copy nomination forms can also be collected from the Civic & Community Centre during business hours.

Nominations will close at midnight, on Friday 8 December 2023.






Asset Management Plans out for consultation

The first set of new Asset Management Plans have been released for community consultation, reviewing three major Council asset classes: roads, footpaths and stormwater.

In accordance with the *Local Government Act 1999*, Council is required to review its Asset Management Plans a minimum of every four years to ensure the Township's valuable services – including roads, footpaths, kerbs, carparks, buildings, stormwater, open spaces, plants and equipment – are properly maintained to a high standard. This allows Council to deliver the required level of service to the community in the most cost-effective manner.



To ensure there is appropriate oversight of these assets, Council reviews sections of the Asset Management Plans to ensure these important assets are well-maintained and meeting community expectations.

This year's draft Asset Management Plans for review cover the roads, footpaths and stormwater systems of the Town of Walkerville.

The draft Asset Management Plans are open for consultation from 9am on Wednesday, 18 October 2023, to 5pm on Friday, 10 November 2023.

Get set for an Italian-inspired, patch-to-primavera adventure with the Grow It Local seed service this spring, featuring heirloom mizuna, chives and radish.


All the seeds you need to create a tasty Italian dish!


