Results of the Walkerville Oval Open Space consultation

Council undertook public consultation on a proposed upgrade to the open space area at Walkerville Oval to gauge community sentiment on the concept design.



The plan included new lighting, court facilities and picnic area. During consultation, you told us that you wanted to retain the two tennis courts and grassed play space behind the cricket nights – and so Council revised the design to reflect exactly that.

At Monday night's Ordinary Council Meeting, Members considered more than 50 responses as part of the engagement process (from 18 January – 7 February 2024) and endorsed an updated concept design based on community feedback.

The original design for the open space included new Walkerville Oval lighting and electrical infrastructure, compliant multi-support court area with lighting (including a change from two courts to one tennis court), an increase from five cricket practice nets to six synthetic pitches and two turf pitches, an upgraded picnic area and new public toilet.

The feedback from the community included:

- strong opposition to the reduction of two tennis courts to one;
- opposition to the quantity of cricket pitches; and
- the brick shade structure and sandpit behind the cricket nets should be retained.

As a result of the above feedback, Council's revised the design to:

- retain the two tennis courts, while upgrading the non-compliant AstroTurf to a complaint hard court surface;
- increase the playing surface to be multi-sport compliant (tennis, netball and basketball);
- include six synthetic cricket pitches;
- retain the grassed area behind the cricket nets; and
- install a new sandpit within the playspace.

Expression of Interest for Walkerville Sports Club Design Committee

Town of Walkerville is establishing a design committee to assist in the upgrade of the Walkerville Sports Club building and adjacent car park.

At the Ordinary Council Meeting on 19 February 2024, Council Members supported the creation of the 'Walkerville Sports Club Design Committee'.

The purpose of this Committee is to:

- work closely with Council's Project Management Team, architect and building contractors to help guide the design direction and scope of the project;
- carefully consider the needs of all key stakeholders;



- provide regular communication with all key stakeholder groups to ensure club design meets the needs of community groups;
- ensure the cost of the renovation remains within Council approved budget; and
- provide advice to Council in relation to the design process and progress.

Mayor Melissa Jones and Councillor James Williams have been appointed to the Committee as Council representatives. There will be three Sports Club representatives and one Walkerville Primary School representative also on the Committee.

To ensure there is community involvement and representation, Council is looking to fill two 'community member' roles on the Committee. The Walkerville Sports Club Design Committee Terms of Reference is available <u>here</u>.

Buckingham Arms update

PlanSA has notified Council that the Buckingham Arms application will be considered by the State Commission Assessment Panel (SCAP) at a public meeting at 9.30am on Wednesday, 6 March 2024.

This meeting will be held on Level 9, 83 Pirie Street, Adelaide, at the SCAP offices. It is recommended that the public get to the meeting 10 minutes prior to the start of the session.

While this meeting is public, you must RSVP to be able to attend. Members of the public can RSVP by contacting the SCAP Secretary, Myles Graham, via email at <u>myles.graham@sa.gov.au</u>.

Additionally, only people who have made a representation can speak at this meeting.

SCAP is considering the plan to redevelop the Buckingham Arms site, which includes the construction of a 10-storey mixed-use building, featuring approximately 180 apartments, 11 townhouses, four-level office building and basement carparking.

Council is not the relevant assessing authority and therefore has limited influence in the outcome.

Stobie pole facelift around Town

Some new stobie pole art is now appearing around Gilberton in recent weeks.



Recent artwork by St Peters artist, Travis Cox – who is well-known for his mosaic artwork on stobie poles through the city – has been spotted around Gilberton.

Decorating stobie poles in the Township is open to all residents who apply through appropriate channels.

First, you must contact SA Power Networks for approval. You can email them at stobiepoleart@groups.sapowernetworks.com.au.

Before painting the stobie poles, please consider stobie pole art requirements from Town of Walkerville, which is available on the <u>Council website</u>.

Some considerations include:

- having the painted image no higher than two metres from ground level;
- the artwork does not constitute as commercial advertising or is a logo, political material, local message or direction or any other material likely to offend;
- notify your neighbours about painting your approved stobie pole; and
- be safe during the painting process, i.e, use orange cones or wear high visibility vests.

After you finalise your work, please supply the Council with an image of the finished work with artist names and location for Council records. This can be emailed to <u>walkerville@walkerville.sa.gov.au</u>.





Draft Long Term Financial Plan consultation

The Town of Walkerville is currently consulting on its draft Long Term Financial Plan (LTFP) 2024-2033, which sets out Council's financial goals for the next 10 years.

The proposed Plan provides a roadmap for the long-term financial position of Council that will guide decision-making in areas such as sustainable services and responsible debt management levels, timing of major projects and revenue requirements, including annual rate rises.

For Council and the wider community, the LTFP is a key component of Council's strategic management framework.

This document is also particularly important with Council embarking on four new major projects, which will develop and change the community landscape and its spaces for residents.

The 10-year Long Term Financial Plan ensures that Council is undertaking its normal daily duties and community services, while also delivering major projects in a safe and financially sustainable way. Council is also meeting legislative requirements under the *Local Government Act 1999*.

At the February Ordinary Meeting of Council, Council Members endorsed the draft Long Term Financial Plan for consultation. The full Council report can be viewed on the <u>Your Say</u> <u>Walkerville website</u>.

Attendees enjoyed wine and cheese during the exciting panel talk and were able to get their books signed at the end.




Monsters workshop


On the weekend, a spooky monsters workshop was held, where children learnt how to design and draw their very own monster and its bedroom.

This planned service disruption will not impact Walkerville Library opening hours or your ability to borrow items in person.




