Expectant mothers will receive important supplies that will help them have a sanitary birth. As supplies and medical support can be limited in developing countries, resources from the birthing kit can help reduce infection. The finished kits will be sent to Birthing Kits Foundation Australia and distributed overseas.

The assembly day will take place from 1.30pm-4.30pm, Sunday, 7 April 2024, at the Walkerville Town Hall.



### Fruit fly restriction zone extended

The current fruit fly zone declared in Salisbury North has been extended, due to further detections of the Queensland fruit fly in the area.



The red zone in Salisbury North has expanded, which means you cannot move home-grown fruit out of the home in this larger restriction zone.

The yellow zone, which includes parts of Vale Park and Walkerville, has been slightly extended. This area allows you to move home-grown fruit and vegetables within the yellow zone area. But you cannot take home-grown fruit and vegetables out of the yellow restriction zone.

Fruit and vegetables purchased from the retail shops do not have the same restrictions.


