Last year she set up Adelaide Koala Rescue & with her team rescue & care for even more. SUPPLEMENTARY PAGE 1 – NOMINATION OF 'CONNECT AND THRIVE WITH AGE' COMMUNITY EVENT

Tell us why you have nominated this person or community event: (up to 400 words)

Confident that there was a strong need in our community for meaningful conversations about life and death matters within a community context evident after the success of the Thrive with Age program 2018, a team of volunteers from the Walkerville Uniting Church were encouraged to consider another series to continue the impact on the health and wellbeing of the our ageing population in Walkerville Council area.

THE CONNECT AND THRIVE WITH AGE team, comprising six women, successfully applied for grant funds from the Office for Ageing, developing a six-month series of workshops with the purpose of promoting positive ageing and wellness. The team designed, coordinated, managed and promoted the workshops, actively recruiting other volunteer members who offered their services of hospitality, catering, bookings and transport.

48% of the Walkerville area population is aged between 55 and 85. The team saw a need to provide a series of workshops not offered in the general community, believing they would achieve the following objectives.

- To keep ageing community members fit and healthy physically, mentally, emotionally, socially and spiritually.
- To encourage open exploration and dialogue as people transition through the stages of the ageing process
- To celebrate individuals' personal life journeys
- To provide a range of programs that were easily accessible physically and financially
- To provide information and guidance supported by professionals with expertise in the field of ageing and wellness.

The CTWA Team and its volunteer support group met the objectives with care, sensitivity and professionalism. The team provided heartfelt hospitality with homemade morning/afternoon tea with personal one on one service. With more than 200 participants, every person left feeling warmly welcomed, supported, informed and more socially connected.

The CTWA included:

- **Death Cafes** – exploring life and death issues and increasing death literacy.
- **10 Things to Know Before You Go** – encouraging a proactive approach towards end of life preparations
- **Finding the Joy in the Ordinary Photography workshop**– using photography to slow down and capture special moments.
- **Finding the Joy in the Ordinary Photography Exhibition** - a display of the participants photography open to the whole community.
- **Writing Your Emotional Will** – providing a space to document one's life story leaving a legacy for loved ones and future generations.
- **Demystifying the Aged Care Puzzle** – exploring options available and encouraging the importance of being prepared before the need arises

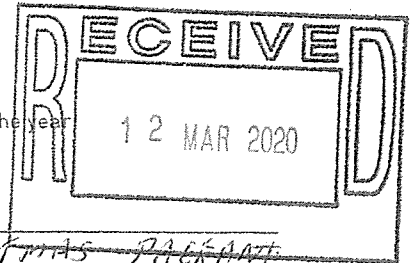

- The event was well-publicized by community banners, local advertising and electronic multimedia. There was a strong presence on Facebook, and it was publicized and well-reported in the Uniting Church e-news and in the state-wide church publication *New Times*.
- The program received publicity in the Walkerville Council newsletter, Walkerville Council community events calendar and in the *Messenger* press.
- There was a great deal of interest from the local media. The team were invited to two radio interviews(ABC Radio and LifeFM) as well as an ABC news article televising one of the Death Cafes that was shown nationally.
- Local medical centres enlisted the team to incorporate more death literacy opportunities within their services.
- Other community groups have shown a great deal of interest in the program and have consequently duplicated similar events into their community projects.
- The team have been regularly offering consultative advice to other community groups.

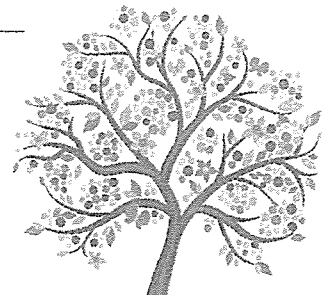
It's been a pleasure to help this extremely well organised function each year.

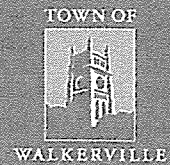
Having witnessed the sheer delight that people of all ages show when viewing the Miniature Christmas Pageant is delightful.

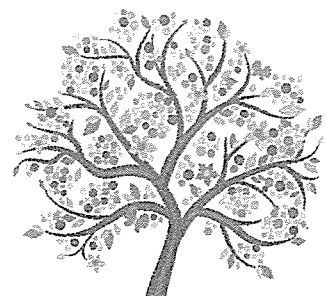

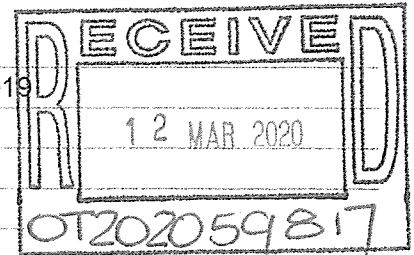

The Walkerville Miniature Christmas Pageant is a unique event in Walkerville and celebrates the commencement of the festive season within the town.

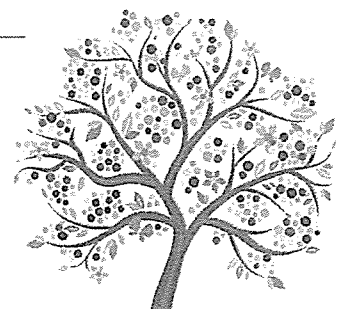
