#### **Annual Business Plan endorsed by Council**

The proposed 2023/24 Annual Business Plan was adopted at the Ordinary Council Meeting on Monday, 17 July 2023.



A total of 15 people provided submissions during the Annual Business Plan consultation process, which ran from 8 June 2023 to 7 July 2023.

Key findings of the consultation for the 2023/24 Annual Business Plan include:

- Feedback was mixed on the proposed rate rise of 6.9%, with 44.4% of respondents saying the rate rise was too high and wanted to lower the rate; 44.4% said the rate rise was ideal and a good middle ground; and 11.2% said the rate rise was too low and would prefer an increase.
- 55.6% of survey respondents felt indifferent on how satisfied they were with Council priorities, whereas 22.2% of people were satisfied and 22.2% were not satisfied with Council priorities.
- 55.6% of people said there were items missing from the budget.

After reviewing the feedback, Council moved to adopt the 2023/24 annual financial budget in its current form.

This budget includes a rate rise of 6.9% and funding for key projects, including the Walkerville Oval redevelopment, 39 Smith Street site refurbishment, Transport Strategy (stage 2), an investigation report into solar panels in the community and another report into undergrounding of powerlines, and additional community events. 
#### Library Survey 2.0 now live


Walkerville Library is providing the expert you need to better utilise your devices and

These works will predominately be undertaken during the early morning, however, a worksite will be established along the Walkerville Terrace footpath of the shopping centre for the duration.


A pedestrian walkway and safety barriers will be in place to protect the community during this time.
