## New facelift for Belt Reserve

Town of Walkerville is undertaking minor landscaping works in Belt Reserve, located on the corner of Church Terrace and Fuller Street in Walkerville.

These works include the installation of a small shelter, new bench seat, brick feature pillars, exposed aggregate concrete pad, new paving and plants.

This development is expected to be finished before Christmas break.









## Repairs to the River Torrens Linear Park shareduse path at Gilberton

Work will begin on a section of the River Torrens Linear Park footpath near Gilberton that was damaged during wild weather.



This work will repair damage from a gum tree that fell during recent storms.

Over this time, the path will be closed between Hackney Road and the Gilberton footbridge, known as Mau Bridge.

Pedestrians and cyclists can detour the area by travelling down Torrens Street and Richmond Street, Hackney, and



then re-enter the path at the carpark at Old Mill Reserve.

# Working towards being a dementia-friendly community

Town of Walkerville has received a certificate from Dementia Australia, acknowledging Council's commitment to continuing to work towards being a dementia-friendly community.



Over the past year, Council has been working closely with Dementia Australia in the process of becoming a dementia-friendly community.

This commitment is ongoing and encourages Council – and the wider community – to think about how to best assist people living with dementia in the Township.

As part of the process, Council staff had training around dementia and how to best help people living with the condition.

Dementia Australia also visited the Civic & Community Centre to assess the facility for dementia-friendliness, with the centre receiving praise for its accessible and user-friendly design.





## Applying to be a volunteer at Town of Walkerville just became easier!

Town of Walkerville has created a new volunteering form for people living with disability or people from a culturally or linguistically diverse background.

Council's standard volunteering expression of interest form is now provided in an Easy Read format, benefitting people in the community who may require more accessible documentation.

commended the Town of Walkerville on the Easy Read form and its initiative that supports volunteer inclusion and diversity in the Council area.


The funding from Volunteering SA&NT was delivered through its Inclusion Ready Grant, which encourages groups, like councils, to better support inclusion in its volunteer processes.

## Wildlife box update

There has been a great improvement in use of the 29 wildlife boxes around the Town of Walkerville over the past year.

The wildlife boxes – which were decorated and painted by local school children as part of the 2022 South Australian Living Artist Festival (SALA) – can be seen in areas along the River Torrens, like Hamilton Reserve.

Wildlife organisation, fauNature, said that the uptake to the boxes in its first year was modest, but there



has been a great improvement in year two of the wildlife boxes.

Almost 50% of the wildlife boxes were in use during the most recent survey, with a further 38% having been used over the previous 12 months.

Six brushtail possums were recorded in four boxes across three different park areas. One ringtail possum was also recorded nesting in Frome Reserve.

Rainbow lorikeets were recorded in four wildlife boxes across three reserves, with five eggs and



four chicks observed, as well as a galah nesting event, with three chicks as a result, in Willow Bend.





Expert from fauNature, James Smith, said, "The utilisation of wildlife boxes at 90% (overall) is high for their second year in service, typically it can take over five years to reach this level of occupation!"

Due to the utilisation that fauNature has logged, especially the number of possums and parrots using the wildlife boxes, it does indicate that natural hollows are a limited resources in three reserve areas.

Three of the wildlife boxes had beehives



established inside, with a fourth opened to reduce the possibility of a hive establishing itself inside. fauNature said that the uptake by bees in the wildlife boxes was higher again this year than would be typically expected.





## Let's reminisce: Miss Dove's Rose Garden School

Circa 1887-1912, Miss Edith Dove (daughter of Archdeacon George Dove) ran a small local school called 'Rose Garden School'.

It was directly behind the rectory on Warwick Street and facing onto Stephen Terrace and catered for young children of the village. In 1912, classes ceased and the cottage was rented out.

The schoolroom had also been used by Mrs Dove for needlework groups fundraising for projects for the St Andrew's Church through the Walkerville Working Society.

The building and land was purchased by the State Government in December 1916 and added to the Walkerville Primary School property. The building is now currently used by the Walkerville Primary School as administrative offices.

This throwback is part of the Town of Walkerville's monthly history series, touching on iconic and famous moments, people and places in Walkerville history. The history of the Rose Garden School was researched and collected with assistance from local historian, Lyn O'Grady.







## Local Government Participation and Elections Review

The Office of Local Government is conducting a State-wide consultation to give the community an opportunity to provide feedback on ideas and suggestions on how communities can better engage with their councils through a council term, particularly at election time.

This review and consultation will focus on these key topics:

- ways to better engage and participate with councils;
- ways to encourage a greater number of more diverse candidates for election to councils;



- ways to increase voter turnout; and
- ways to ensure that council elections are run efficiently, with the highest level of integrity.

The aim of this consultation is to inform reform proposals and the development of the bill to amend Local Government legislation.

Consultation for the Local Government Participation and Elections closes on 1 March 2024.

Remember to recycle all your Christmas rubbish properly! Know what should and shouldn't go into the yellow bin.

Most gift packaging, drink and food containers can be recycled, including:

- Christmas wrapping (paper only – no cellophane or plastic wrapping);
- Cards and cardboard boxes (crush them down to make more room in the bin);
- Bottles and jars (plastic and glass);
- Cans and tins;
- Milk, juice and custard cartons; and
- Foil trays (give them a quick clean first) and foil wrappers (scrunched into a fist



(scrunched into a fist-sized ball).

Please empty and rinse containers before placing them in the recycle bin.

## **Major Projects**

## The Town of Walkerville is currently in the process of planning for three Major Projects:

- Walkerville Bowling & Community Club;
- 39 Smith Street Recreation Centre; and
- Walkerville Sports Club.



These redevelopments will collectively be the largest in the history of Council – with the aim to create a modern sports and community hub within the Township, through the upgrade of the Walkerville Oval precinct and the 39 Smith Street recreation centre. This will become the heart of activity for the area as it will cater to the many ages, demographics and clubs of the community – both now and long into the future.

The delivery of these projects has been on Council's agenda for a number of years and a major hurdle has been affordability. The vulnerability of the building industry and Council's current Long Term Financial Plan (LTFP) have limited the ability to progress as originally planned.

After careful consideration of finances, engagement with stakeholders and site investigations – Council is embarking on a new way forward to ensure all projects are able to be responsibly delivered.

On Monday, 27 November 2023, Council held a Special Meeting to make a decision on its Major Projects. Council Members unanimously supported:

- A new build for the Walkerville Bowling & Community Club building;
- New Walkerville Oval lighting, tennis/netball courts and cricket practice nets;
- Going to market to investigate both a 'refurbishment' option and a 'new build' option for the 39 Smith Street Recreation Centre; and
- A renovation for the Walkerville Sports Club building.


