

FROM THE MAYOR OF WALKERVILLE

In life, the many twists and turns of the unexpected are what change our thought processes and shape our decision-making abilities. It is during these times that checklists and tick boxes help us to remain on track in a world of disorder.

Planning for this financial year during COVID-19 was no exception.

With a new budget, comes a new set of goals and responsibilities. A set of those handy tick boxes, as you will, that we aim to achieve over the forthcoming 12 months. When preparing for the 2021/22 Annual Business *Plan,* I sat there and made a list of the key elements I wanted to see included to assist the Township in its recovery from the effects of COVID-19 and help reignite our community spirit.

At the end of the day, achieving any desired outcome draws back to the initial stages of planning: the list phase – and at the top of mine during the

budget was a rate rise that remained under CPI and in line with our Financial *Guiding Principles*. We had to readjust projects and reconsider operational expenditure to keep it at 1.91% - which may I add, includes growth – but it worked. Council endorsed its 2021/22 Annual Business Plan at its 19 July 2021 Ordinary Meeting. We received a record number of responses during consultation - 237. compared to 21 in 2020 and 11 in 2019. I thank our community for taking the time to fill in our surveys as this truly helps Council in understanding what is important to you.

When you review our new budget, and I highly recommend you do, you will see we have a wealth of new developments and exciting initiatives. I can assure you that although many projects are in their infancy, there is a lot of work happening behind the scenes. I think this promises to be the most exciting year yet under my leadership as Mayor. I am delighted about the thought of the new sports and community hub at Walkerville Oval. I believe this will become the heart of activity for our

Township and I look forward to seeing the many ages. demographics and clubs of our community find it of benefit. We have received \$4 million from the State Government as part of the Local Government Infrastructure Partnership Program, which will allow this vision to come to life, and we will contribute a matching \$4 million.

In addition, we have other exciting new redevelopments in the Council district, which I have no doubt will go a long way in improving the Town for our residents. I am pleased to confirm the Hamilton Reserve Rejuvenation Project is under full swing and we are beginning the upgrade of the eastern end of Levi Park, including a shipwreck-themed playground linking to the history of the boat our early settlers arrived on. Both of these developments will provide a greater use of open public spaces, with the inclusion of a table tennis table, nature play areas and picnic spaces. I look forward to seeing our community out and about as we share these areas for family catch ups and barbecue gatherings with friends. We are also in the



midst of the reactivation of key strategic sites, including Levi Caravan Park with its new lessee and redevelopment, which I am sure will bring new tourism opportunities and travellers to the area.

While the past quarter has involved a focus on the future, I also had the pleasure of being invited to some key community events. In May, I attended the Gilberton Amateur Swimming Club's time capsule event. It is quite a feat for a swim club to survive 100 years without a pool, however, they managed to do just that. The club's history was buried in a time capsule in the Jervis Entrance archway along the River Torrens, off Severn Street.

Although I may not be around, it is hoped the capsule will be retrieved on 17 February 2065 for the club's 150th anniversary.

In June, I attended Propel SA's State Business Breakfast at Norwood Football Club. I gained valuable insights and insider tips from the Minister for Innovation and Skills Hon. David Pisoni MP, South Australian Government Financing Authority General Manager Anna Hughes, Small **Business Commissioner** John Chapman and Deloitte Access Economics Partner Aaron Hill. It made me proud to be a supporter of Propel SA and know that the Town of Walkerville is contributing to providing local businesses with access to the State's

leaders. For those of you who are not aware, Propel SA supports small businesses by providing business advice, networking events and mentoring services. The Town of Walkerville is a proud supporter and funding partner of Propel SA and sits on the Board representing the Township's small business community.

Speaking of events, I am excited about attending our Walkervillage Christmas Fair on 20 November 2021, particularly considering the forced closure last year as a result of COVID-19. It will be wonderful to have the opportunity to mingle with each of you and hear about your experiences over the past year and your goals for the next.

I look forward to continuing to work together and seeing the great work both Council and the community achieve this financial year.



How do I register my dog or cat?

- 1. Go to www.dogsandcats online.com.au
- 2. Select register
- 3. Select register my new animal
- Enter microchip number, desexing ID or transfer code and your surname. If you have not been given these details, select unknown.
- 5. Check if you have an account—if so, select it and proceed without logging in, or continue as a new owner
- 6. Ensure your details are correct
- 7. Complete registration and pay any applicable fee.


The Dog and Cat Management Board have introduced a new campaign where they will be offering a prize draw to cat owners who register their cat's microchip details.

Levi Caravan Park redevelopmen

A swimming pool and new disability-friendly cabins are part of the plan to redevelop Levi Caravan Park into a prime part of the Town of Walkerville in order to increase patronage and tourism opportunities within the district.

The new lessee of the Levi Adelaide Holiday Park -Across Australia Parks & Resorts Pty Ltd – is in the process of undertaking a multi-million dollar upgrade of the park. The redevelopment will be done in stages and will include a swimming pool, and upgraded



cabin accommodation and facilities.

Works of the swimming pool have already commenced and the replacement of the cabins will occur over the coming months with an expected completion in early 2022.

Rezoning of key sites



The State Government is considering the rezoning of the **Buckingham Arms** Hotel and Scotty's **Corner. The applicants** of each proposal have submitted Code Amendments to the **Minister for Planning** and Local Government, Vickie Chapman MP. Therefore, Council is not the decision maker for these proposals.

Gilberton **Code Amendment**

On 1 July 2021, Minister Chapman approved a proposal to initiate a **Code Amendment over 1** Walkerville Terrace Gilberton, which is sought by Pierce Matthews Pty Ltd.

The proposal seeks to rezone approximately 6,200sqm of land adjacent Walkerville Terrace and Northcote Terrace from Local Activity Centre Zone to Urban Corridor Zone (Living) Zone. The zoning change could support a future mixed use development on the site consisting of ground level commercial development and medium density residential above.

The existing Local Activity Centre Zone allows a maximum building height of three storeys. The Code Amendment seeks a maximum building height of six storeys, medium residential density between 35-70 dwellings per hectare and no minimum setbacks from Northcote Terrace, Walkerville Terrace and Robe Terrace, in order to encourage streetscape activation.

Scotty's Corner Code Amendment

The Code Amendment for 1-5 Nottage Terrace and 43 Main North Road, Medindie, seeks to change the zoning of the site from Suburban Business Zone and Established Neighbourhood Zone to the Urban Corridor (Business) Zone.

Under the planned Zone, a future proposal could accommodate a mixed use development of up to seven building levels. Minister Chapman approved the proposal to initiate the Code Amendment over the site, which is approximately 7,300sqm, from YS Super Investments Pty Ltd, on behalf of Future Urban Group, on 22 April 2021.

Traffic plans

Following the first stage of a new 3-hour Parking Permit Zone within parts of Gilberton and Medindie, which commenced on 1 July 2021, Council will be looking at a number of other locations across the Township where all-day parking is an issue for local residents. Areas of particular interest are around the business district of Walkerville and also sections of Medindie.

Other traffic investigatory work will include monitoring and investigations across the five schools in the Township, with a particular focus on parking and pedestrian safety. Administration will also be undertaking a number of vehicle and pedestrian counts across the Town to monitor any potential issues on local streets, as well as our major activity centres.

In addition, Council will be investigating a number of streets in Vale Park, including Evelyn and Clisby Street, regarding cut through traffic. Streets around Vale Park Primary School will also be looked at, including Arundel Street and Tonkin Street, to monitor and identify parking issues around school pick-up times.

Tennis court resurfacing



Council's three tennis sites across Town – Willow Bend, Levi Park and Gilbert Street – are receiving new surfaces, netting and line marking in September 2021.

Works will include a new blue acrylic surface to meet current play standards, as well as a basketball ring for the Willow Bend site. Levi Park will also receive netball and basketball provisions.

All courts are likely to be closed for approximately two weeks while these works are occurring. Asphalt was laid in early August. The new acrylic surfaces and line marking are scheduled to commence from this week.

Levi Park



A table tennis table, picnic area, barbecue and new fenced enclosure are now available to the community as part of a completed upgrade at the western end of Levi Park.

Nestled at the corner of Vale Street and Lansdowne Terrace in Vale Park, this once vacant, dry section of Levi Oval is now a vibrant and engaging green space for our community to relax in and gather with family and friends. Opened earlier this month, the Levi Park upgrade includes irrigated turf, mature almond trees and ground covers.

The Town of Walkerville project team created the vision and assisted in the completion of this unique project. Council's contractor LCS Landscapes made the vision for the site a reality with their experience and high quality delivery.

The story of "The Three Ducks" has been stamped in time to pay tribute to the Township's history.

As part of the Levi Park upgrade, duck feet can be found throughout the reserve in remembrance of the daughters of Philip Levi, who was an early settler and pastoralist of South Australia. In 1853, Levi purchased Vale House and the surrounding land, which his family occupied for 97 years. In their youth, Levi's daughters would often be seen following their mother in single file as they walked around the local streets, which earned them the nickname of "The Three Ducks". Levi Park The story of Eden

A shipwreck-themed playground linking to the history of the boat our early settlers arrived on is planned as part of an upgrade to the eastern end of Levi Park.

Designs are based on the Levi family, who the park is named after, and the ship they first arrived on when moving to South Australia – the Eden.

Council's Beautification Team is currently working on finalising concepts for the area, which will also include a range of trees, shrubs and landscaping.

Community consultation will occur once designs are finalised, however, a snapshot of the proposed concept can be seen above.



Hamilton Reserve A lapse in time

The much anticipated Hamilton Reserve Rejuvenation Project is underway, which includes the construction of picnic and barbecue areas, nature play spaces, a cycling track and toilet facilities.

The project creates defined areas by intensifying plantings to create distinct activity spaces, identifying natural pedestrian routes that connect residential areas through to the River Torrens and formalising natural surface materials for prime usage.

To capture the progress of the project throughout construction, Council has arranged the installation of a time lapse camera (installation of the camera shown below). A full time lapse video will be shared upon project completion, which is expected in October.



Council acknowledges the Government of South Australia for its contribution of \$319,825 towards the project as part of the 2020/21 Open Space and Places for People Grant Program.
