Let's reminisce: Hackney Bridge

This single-span iron bridge - known as Hackney Bridge - with stone supports, was the first of its kind constructed in South Australia and was opened for use in 1885.

Located on the city ring route and at the edge of the suburb of Gilberton, the iron bridge replaced the old wooden 'Company's Bridge' which was built to give easy access to the wheat farmers from the northern side of the river to the South Australian Company's flour mill.

The flour mill once stood near where the Hackney Hotel was later built.

In 1938, the old timber decking of the bridge was replaced with concrete and widened to incorporate a footpath.

Of the bridges over the Torrens today, it is possibly the third oldest.

In about 1960s, a duplicate bridge across the Torrens was constructed to cope with the increased traffic.

Road safety around schools

With the annual Walk Safely to School Day fast approaching, on Friday, 10 May 2024, it's a good time to refresh yourselves on the Australian road rules around our local schools.

The Town of Walkerville has five schools within the Council area and student safety is very important to Council. Do you know the rules around school crossings and zones?



School Zones and Speed Limits

School zone signs are installed on most roads around schools. A zigzag white line is also usually marked on the road to let drivers know they are approaching a school zone.

Drivers must not exceed 25km/h at any time of the day or night when a child is in a school zone, including weekends and school holidays.

Please slow down as you approach a school zone at all times of the day and night to check if there are children in the area. Children can be present outside of normal school hours because of the many activities that take place in or around schools.

Other tips to remember:

- Allow enough time to get your child to the school entrance safely and without rushing.
- Say goodbye to your child on the school side of the road. Never get them to cross the road to their school entrance alone.
- If you can, park a few streets away and walk your child to school. This is also good for teaching your child road safety skills.

School Crossings

When it comes to using a school crossing, near enough is NOT good enough. Make the effort to use the crossings even if it means walking a little further. Crossings are the best place to cross, as drivers will be more alert for pedestrians.



Emu Crossings

An Emu Crossing has a red 'Children Crossing' flag displayed on red and white striped posts. When the flags are displayed drivers must give way to pedestrians either crossing or about to cross the road.

Emu crossings are located within School Zones, which have a speed limit of 25km/h when children are on the road or footpath. If the 'Children Crossing' flags are not up, the 25km/h school zone speed limit still applies if there are children present.



Koala Crossings

A Koala Crossing consists of two yellow flashing lights mounted on red and white striped poles. Koala Crossings operate only when the yellow lights are flashing, A 25km/h speed limit applies between signs on the approaches to the crossing when the lights are flashing, and drivers must stop and give way to anyone using the crossing or about to cross the road.

School monitors may be present at the crossings, and it is important to obey the Stop signs used by the monitors.

This event will run for 90 minutes, with a further 30 minutes of question time.



At a recent Special Council Meeting, Councillors considered both a refurbishment of the current building and a knock-down-rebuild option. Members unanimously supported a

Backpacks 4 SA Kids in desperate need of more backpacks

Do you have backpacks lying around piling up in storage? Well Backpacks 4 SA Kids are in desperate need of backpack donations.

Backpacks 4 SA Kids' mission is to offer resources that contribute to the care, safety and wellbeing of children and young people during periods of

dislocation from home and routine care.



The organisation works alongside child protection, child welfare, family violence and homelessness agencies to provide as many displaced children as possible with an age-appropriate backpack containing a range of essentials and other goodies.

The charity provides four unique tailored programs under the Backpacks 4 SA Kids banner, including:

<u>Backpacks</u>: For kids who leave home with little to no notice and often have no clothing or other essentials.

<u>Home Starter Packs</u>: Designed for families who have left a violent relationship at home and need to start again.

Anchor Packs: For young people aged 12-24 who are experiencing homelessness.

<u>Christmas Program</u>: Provided to newborns to 18-year-olds with Christmas gifts when entering emergency care.

The Town of Walkerville is part of a long list of drop-off points, accepting donations during business hours, Monday to Friday 9am to 5pm, in the foyer of the Civic & Community Centre.
