Subject to any variation by the Council, this permit is subject to:-

- A. The permit holder agreeing to the general conditions of the permit as contained herein.
- B. The permit holder agreeing to all Special Conditions which the Council may determine.
- C. The permit holder paying the prescribed fee.

General Conditions of Permit

- 1) The permit holder agrees to indemnify and to keep indemnified the Council, its servants and agents and each of them from and against all actions, costs, claims, damages, charges and expenses whatsoever which may be brought or made or claimed against them or any of them arising out of or in relation to the issuing of the permit.
- 2) The permit holder through payment of the prescribed fee, is covered by a public risk insurance policy for the minimum sum of ten million dollars (\$10,000,000) against all actions, costs, claims, damages, charges and expenses whatsoever which may be brought or made or claimed against the permit holder in relation to the granting of this permit.
- 3) The permit is **NOT** transferable.
- 4) The permit holder shall comply with and give all notices required by any Act of Parliament, Ordinance, Regulation or By-law relating to the activity.

- 5) No permit will be granted for the deposit of materials on a footpath where the footpath is narrower than 1.8 m.
- 6) A permit may be granted to deposit materials on the nature strip provided a 1.8m width of footpath is kept clear.
- 7) In the case of a Temporary Rubbish Disposal Unit, the unit shall be located on the road/footpath within 300 millimetres of and parallel to the kerb alignment or property boundary, and that 3 metres of clear carriageway exists for passage of other vehicles.
- 8) The Unit to be placed at least six (6) metres from the intersection boundary alignment.
- 9) No object, material, matter or other thing shall extend outside of the Rubbish Disposal Unit or approval area as indicated in this permit.
- 10) The permit holder shall ensure that the area is adequately lit at night and that all appropriate barriers, barricades and warning devices are installed to protect the public. The permit holder shall also ensure that the Rubbish Disposal Unit or deposited material does not obstruct the vision of motorists or unduly obstruct the passage of pedestrians.
- 11) The Council may require consultation prior to the issuing of the permit with adjoining owners, occupiers and other persons if road/footpath occupation is required in front of properties other than the property owned or occupied by the permit holder. The Council may require the results of the consultation.
- 12) The permit holder must take all reasonable precautions to avoid damage to the road/footpath and any improvements and structures located in the road/footpath. The permit holder must immediately notify the Council of damage to the road/footpath or any Council property located within or adjacent to the road/footpath.
- 13) Any activity around street trees must be carried out with consideration to preserving the health and condition of the tree.
- 14) The permit holder will be responsible to reimburse the Council for all its costs to repair or rectify any damage caused as a result of the permit holder's use or misuse of the road/footpath.
- 15) The permit holder agrees to minimise any disturbances or nuisances to users of land adjacent to the road/footpath or to vehicles or pedestrians travelling along the road/footpath.
- 16) The permit can be granted for a period up to and including 14 days.
- 17) At the expiry of this permit Council Officers may inspect the area to ensure that it is clean and tidy and no damage has occurred.
- 18) This permit will not come into operation until payment of a fee of \$50.00 has been provided to the Council and a copy of this document, signed by the Council has been returned to you.**
- 19) The Council reserves the right to revoke the permit if the permit holder fails to comply with a condition of this permit, a direction of Council or if deemed necessary on safety or other grounds, in which case Council may arrange for removal of the Rubbish Disposal Unit/deposited material. Any reasonable costs incurred by the Council as a result of the permit holder's failure to comply with the permit will be recovered from the permit holder.

I acknowledge that I have read and understand the permit conditions and agree to abide by the said conditions.

I hereby apply for the above permit and undertake to remove the materials at the expiration of this permit. I agree to pay the cost of Council reinstating any damage to the road/footpath, nature strip etc resulting from the depositing of materials etc.
